"Last of the Cuiva": Introduced by Dr. Bernardo Berdichewsky, about a vanishing tribe living in a remote jungle in Columbia.

"The Inquiry": Introduced by Dr. Bernardo Berdichewsky and Dr. Matthew Spier, is the record of the Berger Commission on our northern lands and people. Also: "The Land is the Culture".

"Ways of Seeing", "This is Marshall McLuhan", and "Adscape": Introduced by Dr. Patricia Groves and Sarah Minhas, about advertising through the eyes of sociologists.

"Afghan Village" and "Afghan Women": Introduced by Karin Lind, depicting village life and the seclusion of women in rural Afghanistan.
