**YOUR VOTE TOMORROW** — and that of thousands of other parents in our four School Districts — will decide whether our children will have the opportunity to acquire the kind of education they need.

By voting Thursday on this Plebiscite you will give authority **ONLY** to plan and start a college in existing premises at West Vancouver Secondary School.

### What is a Community College?

It is merely another very necessary advance in providing our children with an education to fit them to survive and grow in our present society.

Years ago an elementary education was accepted as sufficient. Later, graduation from a secondary school was acceptable in our economy. A very few students went on to university, and entered the professional field.

Today, this concept is not good enough. For generations we have said that one of the commitments of democracy is that each individual is entitled to the opportunity for the fullest development of whatever talent and potential he or she possesses.

A community college is a two-year academic transfer program equivalent to the first two years of university. Students who graduate transfer into our universities.

It provides two-year technological courses; training and re-training courses for adults; college preparation courses for students who have not completed grade 12; general interest courses for adults.

It will serve those in the 18 to 80 year group.

### How College Will Operate

This will be an "open door" college. Those who do not possess entrance qualifications will be able to take make-up courses to qualify.

The academic program will be university standard and allow students to transfer when they graduate.

Technical courses will be two-year certification courses, as will those in Business Administration, Community Service, Art and Merchandising etc.

Students on the vocational courses must take a broad core of academic subjects to graduate them as wellrounded, knowledgeable citizens.

Hours will be from 4:15 to 10:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 24 hours a week

Lectures will be 11/2 hours in length.

Full load will be 15 credits.

There will be two semesters a year now, September to December and January to April. There will be three semesters in the future.

Cost will be \$100 per semester, full load. Fee for college year of two semesters will be \$200. Student has option of taking courses up to five in number at \$20 per course.

#### COST TO THE TAXPAYER

The North and West Vancouver taxpayer with a home valued at \$25,000 will pay about \$7 per year for the college while it is housed in West Vancouver Secondary School.

Sechelt and Howe Sound with the same value home would pay \$4 per year. For a \$12,000 home in these areas, cost would be only \$2.

If college had to acquire a campus and buildings in 1973 to serve 2,000 students, cost would be \$25 for the North and West Vancouver home and \$7 for Sechelt and Howe Sound.
