GET-OUT-THE-VOTE COMMITTEE

Objective - To make sure that all voters are alerted to vote by organizing last-minute phoning groups and transportation to poll set-up.

While the ideal is to phone all eligible veters, this has been found to be not practical. Of the greatest importance is the slerting of all parents -- from those of the baby born last week, to the parents of high school students.

If time, arrangements should be made to have workers at the polls on March 7th, checking in the last few hours for parents who have not voted, and then phoning them.

- 1. Get list of parents and phone numbers from School Principals, heads of kindergartens, well-baby clinics, and/or local hospital.
- 2. Plan to divide list so that phoning job evens out. If the job is taken en a school-by-school basis, see that all schools have sufficient help. Senier Secondary students and teachers may help.
- 3. Check with your Secretary-Treasurer on any questions involving procedure, legality, etc. If you are working at a poll on election day, remove your bumper sticker;

This Committee is of VITAL IMPORTANCE because it is the closing action of the campaign. Rarely has a college campaign failed when the job of the get-out-the-vote committee did a thorough job.
