Mr. MacDonald opened the meeting by presenting the draft inter-Board agreement which he had prepared and discussed with Mr. Espley, a copy of which was given to each committee member. Mr. Espley veteed section "A", stating that the college should avoid subsidizing any students. Mr. MacDonald therefore recommended that section "B" be adopted, using a uniform mill rate for capital costs and a pro-rated mill rate based on the Grade XII enrolment of each of the school districts for operating costs. There was a discussion on the advantages and disadvantages of this plan, and it was suggested that the agreement should contain the following provisos:

- (1) equality of entrance opportunities to students from all participating school districts.
- (2) provision for adjustment of the agreement if the college enrolment from a given school district was more than, say, 10% either way of the number of students provided for.

MOVED by Mr. Powell; seconded by Mr. Malcolm:

That the capital costs and service to capital be distributed among the participating Boards on a uniform mill rate basis.
