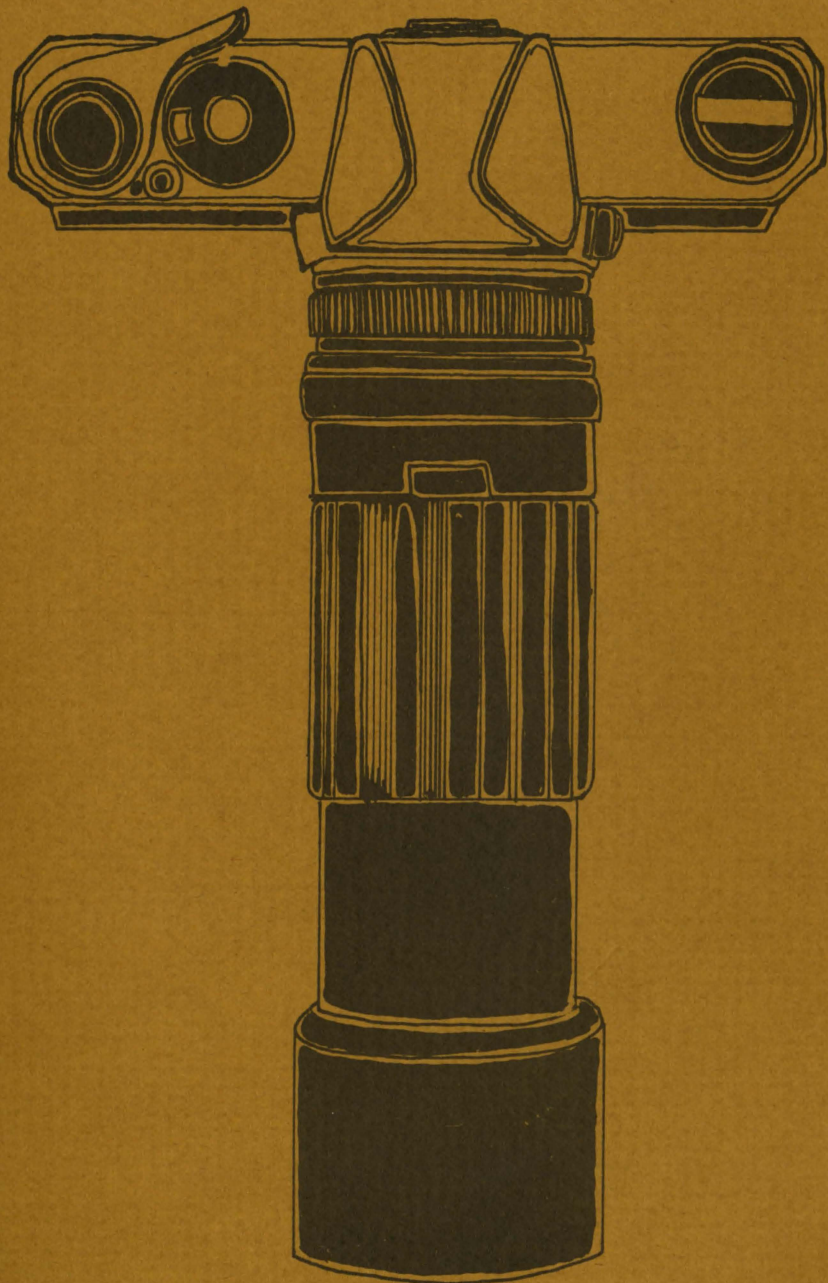

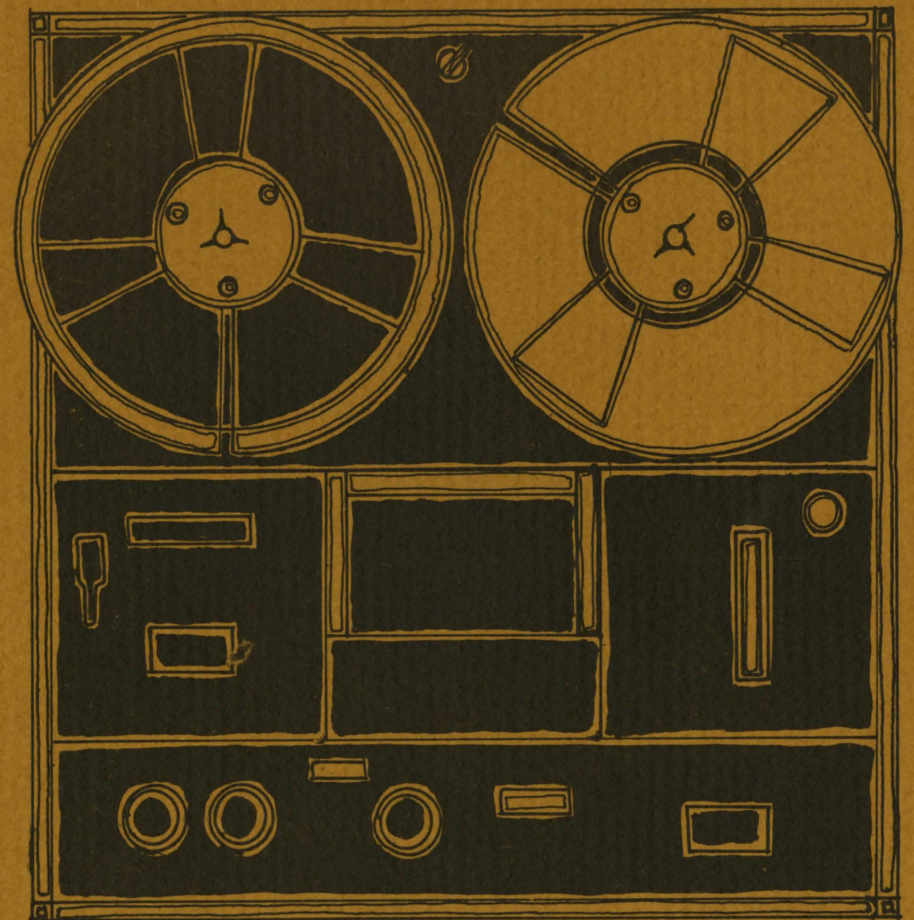


Photography

The photography program includes: camera operation (35mm and larger formats), lighting, developing and printing, special graphics techniques and basic colour processing; applications in photojournalism, displays and educational aids such as slides, filmstrips and study prints.

Audio

The audio program includes: interviewing, scripting, editing and mixing techniques; and applications in documentaries, dramatic formats, sound tracks for film, TV and multi-media productions and special educational materials.



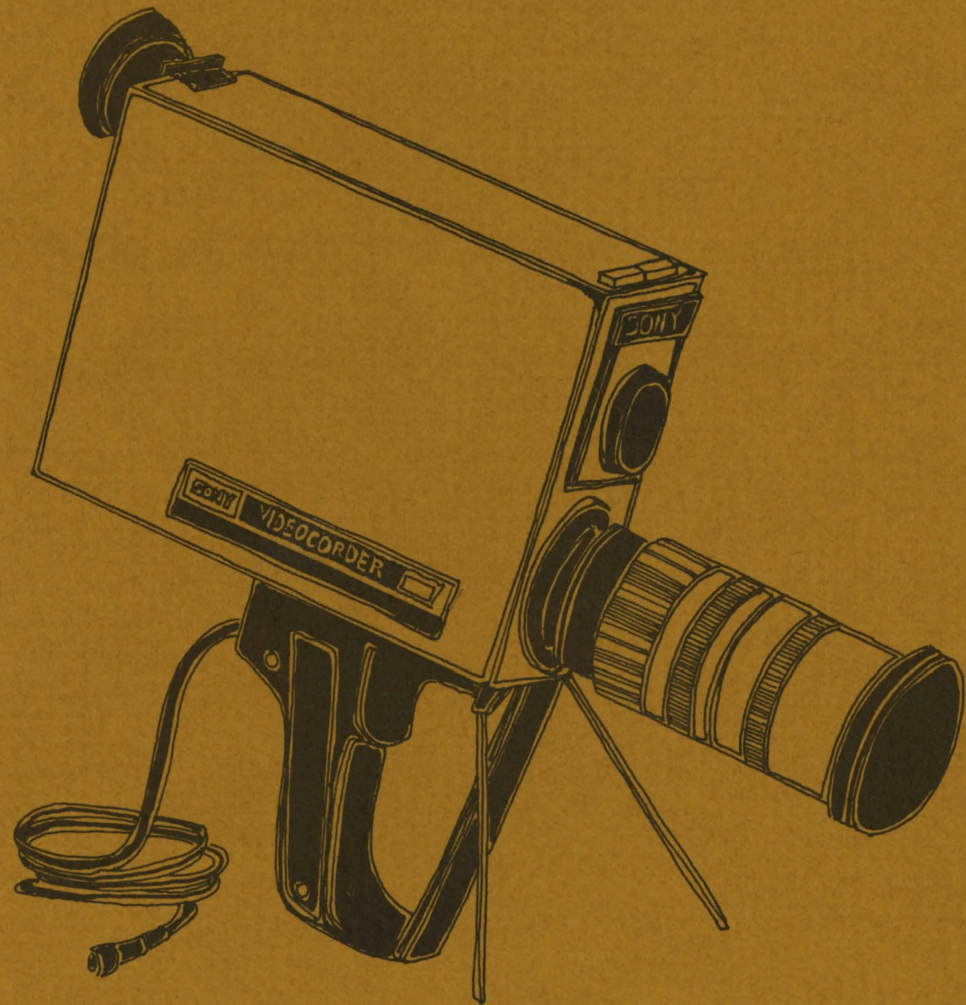


Film

The film program includes: basic camera work, editing, lighting for cine, animation, documentary production, theatrical continuity films, sound, and double-system synchronized sound work. The Department now works only in Super 8mm.

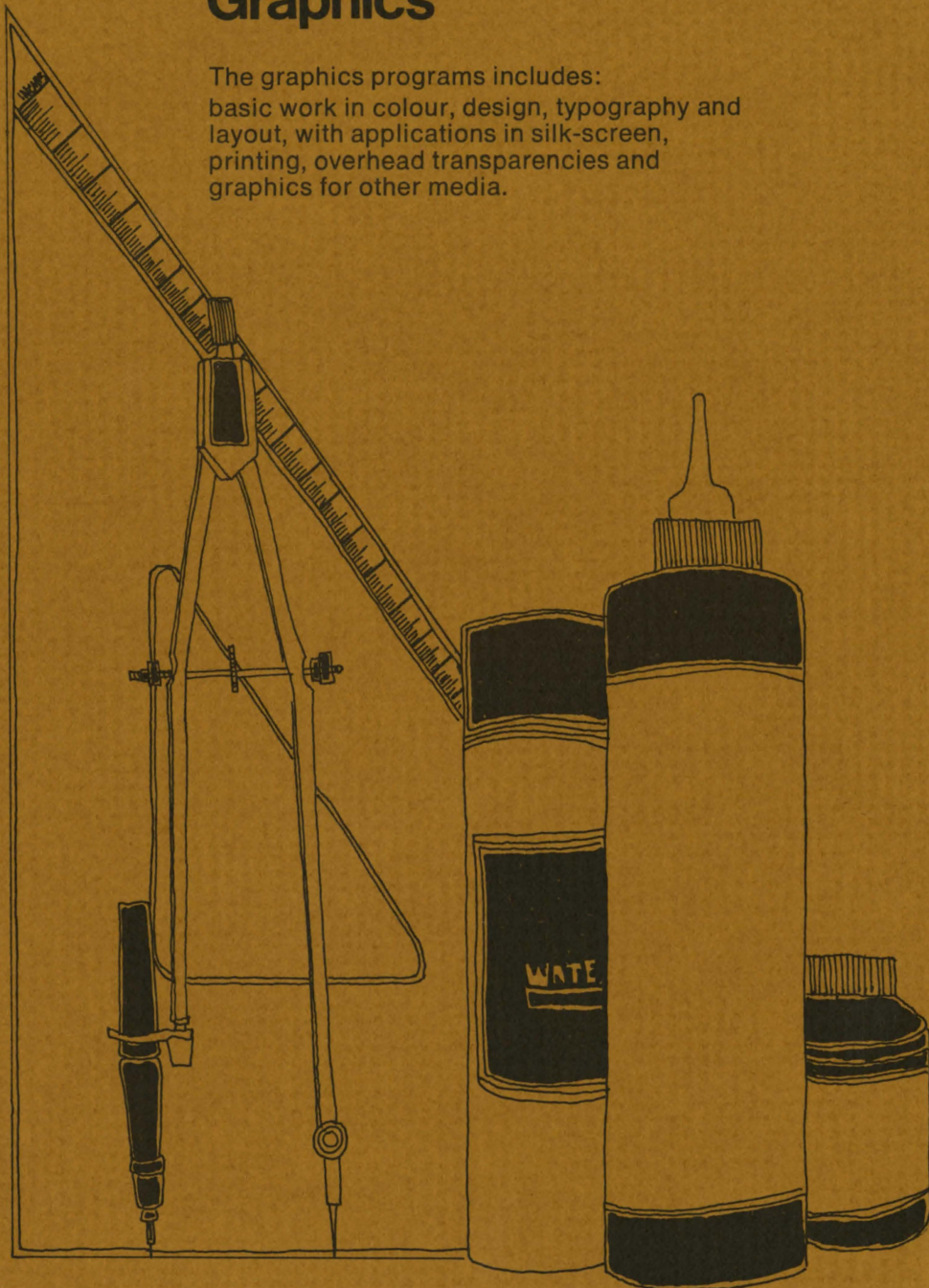
Television

The television program includes: camera work, editing, lighting, sound, directing and graphics; working with 1/2 inch and 1 inch videotape systems, portable and full studio work is done, for application in documentaries, educational TV, micro-teaching, and CATV programming.



Graphics

The graphics programs includes:
 basic work in colour, design, typography and
 layout, with applications in silk-screen,
 printing, overhead transparencies and
 graphics for other media.

ADDITIONAL COURSES

Include Theories of Learning, Instructional Design, Communications and the operation of Resource Centres.

Students will make visits to a variety of Resource Centres. Each student will spend a period of one month in a practical work situation.

The program leads directly to employment in the Educational Media field and students will be given every assistance to find employment through the program prior to their graduation.

How, When, Where....

Persons over 18 years of age or with Secondary school graduation are eligible for admission to the College and this program. Candidates for the Media Resources Program must be interviewed by the program co-ordinator in May or August. Admission is based on portfolio, past work and experience in related fields, general ability and the applicant's interests.

College fees are \$7.00 per credit hour, to a maximum of \$100.00 per semester. In addition, students in the Media Resources Program should expect to pay \$25.00-\$50.00 per semester for supplies.

In addition to the full-time 2-year program, the Department offers extra sections of some of its courses, for other students of the College and the community.
