## TV writing course at Cap College

We may think that the number of TV stations available to viewers has increased dramatically in the last few years, but it is estimated that over 100 channels will be available very soon. Those channels will need programs, those programs will need writers, and at Capilano College two new credit free courses on Writing for Film and TV intend to train some of those writers.

These courses will be taught by Merv Campone, well-known TV and film writer, actor and producer. From his experience in over one hundred TV shows as writer, and in many as director and producer as well, he has developed an exceptional grasp of the complex process of TV production. He has also worked as story editor, actor or series consultant in many more shows and is currently working on the CBC show "The Beachcombers."

The writing courses, which focus on drama, are intended to help writers develop their craft to a level that will enable them to present their ideas and complete their script assignments in the most professional manner possible. The basic course, which starts

Sept. 20, will run for six sessions on Monday and Thursday evenings, and will be followed by an advanced course which will run Monday evenings for eight sessions starting October 18.
