McRae donates \$1m to Cap College

THREE years after donating \$1 million to Capilano College's Asia Pacific Management

Cooperative Program (APMCP), Canadian

businessman and philanthropist, Robert McRae, has pledged another \$1 million to support the college's international programs.

The new donation is intended to promote international study and work experiences for students in the Latin American Management (LAMP) Program and APMCP.

It is specifically directed at developing credit-transfer agreements with master's degree programs at reputable international universities.

McRae and his daughter, Elizabeth Peck, run Canadians Resident Abroad, Inc., a Toronto company that sends tax and investment reports to Canadian expatriates around the globe.

An inspirational speaker, his philosophy is well known amongst the students, graduates and faculty members of Capilano College's international programs. He often says: "I don't want to be old and poor or dead and rich."
