



Collectively, the members have more than 170 album credits and have released four albums of their own, of which Fire Me Up is the most recent. They are a voice full of joy, life and energy!



THE SHUFFLE DEMONS began life in downtown Toronto as Yonge Street buskers. Their debut album Streetniks won a CASBY award and was nominated for a JUNO.
