

#### **CASSANDRA WILSON**

In 1988, Cassandra Wilson released her third album, the astonishing Blue Skies in which she stunningly reinterpreted such standards as Shall We Dance and I've Grown Accustomed To His Face. She established an instant reputation

as a singer of immense talent, and critical praises have been pouring in ever since. Billboard recently lauded her as the "heir apparent to divas Betty Carter, Carmen McRae, Abbey Lincoln and Sarah Vaughan." Moreover, jazz artists are lining up to work with her. Blood In The Fields, a new big-band piece written by Wynton Marsalis, features Cassandra Wilson on vocals. Cassandra is definitely the most accomplished jazz singer of her generation and she easily surpasses most of her rock and pop contemporaries. Her recent CD Blue Light 'Til Dawn (Blue Note) is a captivating collection which sees Wilson stretch the role of the jazz singer. She expands the traditional repertoire by offering unique and heartfelt interpretations of songs from the blues, R&B, folk, and rock genres. With nine diverse albums to her credit, Cassandra Wilson is perhaps the most exciting and original vocalist on the scene today. With Brandon Ross guitar, Lonnie Plaxico bass, Charlie Burnham viola/mandolin, Jeff Haynes percussion, and Lance Carter drums.

#### J.J. JOHNSON QUINTET

This living jazz legend is one of the music's true innovators who belongs in the pantheon of great jazz instrumentalists along with Louis Armstrong, Lester Young, Coleman Hawkins, Dizzy Gillespie, and Charlie Parker. The history of *jazz trom*bone was forever changed when Johnson emerged on the scene in the mid-1940s. Instead of playing the usual growls and slurs associated with swing and dixieland players, J.J. used the instrument to play the fast, agile lines of the bebop



saxophonists. He brought the same facility to the trombone that Dizzy Gillespie brought to the trumpet and Charlie Parker brought to the alto saxophone. Over a long and illustrious career this jazz giant has worked with almost every major jazz figure: Count Basie, Clifford Brown, Max Roach, Miles Davis, Sonny Rollins, McCoy Tyner, Milt Jackson, and Stan Getz are but a glittering handful. Many of his recordings have become classics. A brilliantly creative soloist and remarkable technician, J.J. Johnson returns to Vancouver with an all-star group that features Rufus Reid bass, Bruce Cox drums, and Dan Faulk saxophone plus a hot new pianist replacing Renee Rosnes.

#### CHRISTIAN MCBRIDE QUARTET

"I love him...I'm in love with what he does...I think he's probably the best out there right now."-Betty Carter

At 22 years of age, Christian McBride is the most sought after young bassist on the jazz scene. He has already played hundreds of club, concert, and festival dates around the world. He's also been featured on over 70 recordings with leading jazz musicians from Roy Hargrove, and Joshua Redman, to Freddie Hubbard, Wynton Marsalis, and Pat Metheny. McBride's recently released debut recording as a leader called Gettin' To It amply displays his great tone, superb phrasing, and soulful sound. Phenomenal! McBride is truly one of greatest bass players to emerge in the last 30 years.

#### Africa Fete

#### June 26 Commodore

Africa Fete is a spectacular event that brings together more than 60 musicians in a celebration of African music, art, and culture. The artists appearing in Africa Fete '95 are Baaba Maal, Boukman Eksperyans, Femi Kuti, and Oumou Sangare. Baaba Maal is renowned for his ability to join the traditional sounds of Senegal with cutting edge contemporary western music. He has recorded three highly successful CDs for Mango Records, the latest being *Firin' in Fouta*. "A great student of African folk traditions, Maal cues the *kora* to invoke south Senegal, the sabar drum to signify cosmopolitan Dakar, and the millet-pounding yela rhythm to awaken the world" (Spin). Boukman Eksperyans, Haiti's premier band was banned from performing in their homeland by the now defunct military regime for being "a voice of freedom." The band is now back performing in Haiti and has just released their third recording. A powerful group, their music embraces the trance-like rhythms of voodoo and the spiritually uplifting messages found in Caribbean music forms like soca, calypso, and reggae. Femi Kuti is from Nigeria and is the son of renowned African musician Fela Kuti. Femi's music has been described as Afro-pop with a heavy draw on American/African jazz and funk. But Femi also fuses the traditional and the contemporary. His rhythm section consists of traditional African instruments joined by a horn section and electric guitars. Femi's debut album was recently released on Tabu/Motown. Oumou Sangare is arguably West Africa's finest and most popular singer. Dubbed the "Madonna from Mali" by New York Newsday, she has a voice of exceptional range and quality. Her sound is a modern reworking of an ancient Malian tradition—the music of the hunters of

Awesome." (Time Out).



Nominated for five Grammys, the Louisiana-based BeauSoleil is hailed by critics, fellow musicians, and fans worldwide as America's premier Cajun band. With fiddles and Acadian accordions up front with the singers, this music is festive and irresistably danceable. Cajun music originated in the bayou deltas of southeastern Louisiana among descendants of 17th century French refugees from Nova Scotia. The members of BeauSoleil have long been respected as masters of the tradition but they're also recognized as master experimenters who blend in more contemporary influences. The group stirs up a rich, varied musical sauce piquante that mixes Cajun and zydeco music with blues, country, Tex-Mex, Caribbean and every other style that has made its way down the Mississippi. Leader/fiddler Michael Doucet is no purist; his virtuosic flights include non-Cajun references and he lets the songs sizzle.

This extremely talented *young* black vocal group is resolutely dedicated to carrying on the art of unaccompanied four-part gospel harmony singing. This traditional music form has an especially brilliant heritage in their home base of Jefferson County, Alabarna. Organized in 1979 by *music director/lead tenor* James Alex Taylor, the group includes James' brothers Steve and Barry Taylor, who sing *baritone* and *bass* respectively, and lead singers Reginald "Ricky" Speights *baritone*, and Wayne Williams *tenor*. The Sunlights like to call themselves a "traditional Southern gospel group," but they also use the untraditional Motown and other soul-oriented labels of the '60s and '70s. Their a cappella harmonies recall Smokey Robinson, Aretha Franklin, and Marvin Gaye yet their own compositions show the influence of some of the classic quartets of the '50s and '60s, par-

ticularly the Soul Stirrers and Sensational Nightingales. The five-piece Birmingham Sunlights are an unforgettable musical experience. Hear why audiences from Alabama to Africa have been overwhelmed by their extraordinary singing. Amen!

#### Seamus Blake Trio

Vancouver-born, New York-based saxophanist Seamus Blake is one of Canada's brightest young jazz players. Tremendously talented, he's played with Pat Metheny, Victor Lewis, George Gruntz, and Kenny Wheeler. He'll appear here with Brad Turner piano and Chris Nelson bass. #### ALLaw Holdsworth

#### June 28 Commodore

"Holdsworth is the best in my book. He's fantastic."—Eddie Van Halen With characteristic British self-effacement, Holdsworth downplays the notion of being a "guitar god." His earliest musical inspiration came from electric jazz guitar pioneer Charlie Christian. Like Christian, Les Paul, and Jimi Hendrix before him, Holdsworth has reinvented the electric guitar, in terms of how it sounds and how it is played. From his early work with noted jazz players Jean-Luc Ponty and Tony

Williams' Lifetime, and pioneering rock groups such as U.K., Soft Machine, and Bruford, to his more recent solo outings with his own band, Holdsworth has consistently broken through to new musical vistas. As a guitar soloist Holdsworth has few peers, and as a bandleader and composer he takes his music to a level where few musicians may follow. In 1986, Holdsworth introduced the *synthaxe*—a guitar synthesizer that allows him to create and explore an infinite range of aural textures. In the summer of 1968, Dave Holland moved from Britain to New York at the invitation of Miles Davis. That's when his career as one of the most talented bassists in contemporary music truly began to take off. During his three years with Miles, Holland played on such groundbreaking recordings as *In a Silent Way* and *Bitches Brew*. By the late '70s, he had worked extensively with Anthony Braxton and Sam Rivers and established himself as one of *the* acoustic bassists of the decade. During the '80s, Holland led his own groups which included Kenny Wheeler, Julian Priester, Steve Coleman, and others.

His enormous talents allow him to hop across barriers that normally separate styles and generations. He is as comfortable playing with bop pianist Hank Jones as he is with the adventurous guitarist Derek Bailey. In 1990 Dave toured internationally with Jack Dejohnette, Herbie Hancock, and Pat Metheny in support of Metheny's Question and Answer recording. For the past decade, Holland's small groups have helped set the course for the new jazz mainstream. With Eric Person saxophone, Steve Nelson vibes, and Gene Jackson drums.



#### Holmes Brothers

It has been said that soul music came into being when gospel took a walk down the aisle with the blues. The marriage of these two musical idioms finds perfect expression in the music of The Holmes Brothers, an unique blend of blues, gospel, soul, R&B, and country that "suggests holiness but breathes the late-night juke joint air" (*Philadelphia Inquirer*). Together for 20 years, but recently "discovered" playing in the New York bar scene, this tric's winning combination of churchy soul and roadhouse raunch has been documented on four hot CDs, as well as at

club dates and on concert tours around the world. It's a knockout band with Wendell Holmes on stinging *electric guitar*, Sherman Holmes laying down some solid bass lines, and Willie "Popsy" Dixon on *drums*. Their vocal harmonies are exhilarating, drawing on deep roots in gospel. But the scope of their material shows them equally at home with classic soul tunes like Jimmy Reed's *Baby, What You Want Me To Do.* The ensemble singing is precise as a razor cut. Appearing on a red-hot double bill with The Bobby Parker band featuring Little Jimmy King.

In the world of rock n' roll this incredible band would be called a supergroup. In the jazz world they would be deemed all-stars. Stanley Clarke bass, Al Di Meola guitar, and Jean-Luc Ponty violin call themselves simply The Rite of Strings. Stanley Clarke is a monster bass player whose early playing credits include Horace Silver, Stan Getz, Gil Evans, and Dexter Gordon. He then went electric and joined Return To Forever with Di Meola, Chick Corea, and Lenny White and later collaborated with George Duke in the Clarke/Duke Project. He's also been a member of The New Barbarians, which included Keith Richards and Ron Wood of The Rolling Stones, and scored films, including the acclaimed Boys 'N The Hood. A Grammy winner, Clarke has also been Rolling Stone magazine's Jazzman of the Year. Al Di Meola debuted with Return to Forever in 1974 and the success of that group enabled him to launch a solo career that has to date, resulted in 13 albums and four aold records. In 1980 he formed a trio with John McLaughlin and Paco De Lucia that wowed audiences worldwide. In 1987, he formed the Super Guitar Trio with Larry Coryell and Birelli Lagrene. He's also performed with artists as diverse as Jan Hammer, Phil Collins, and Airto Moreira. Guitar

Player magazine has bestowed 13 awards upon him since 1976. Jean-Luc Ponty burst upon the scene in 1973 when he joined Frank Zappa and the Mothers of Invention followed by a stint with John McLaughlin's Mahavishnu Orchestra. He started his own group in 1975 and since then has recorded 16 albums while establishing himself as the creator of a new and influential style of violin playing. Ponty has performed with symphony orchestras, jazz groups, fusion bands and with African musicians. The Rite of Strings premiered in Europe in 1994 and the trio has performed to sell-out houses ever since! Don't miss this entirely exciting dream band.

Larry Ochs' "The Secret Magritte" will receive its Canadian premiere at the Jazz Festival. Commissioned by Antwerpen 93 Festival, the composition is an homage to the night thoughts of René Magritte. The performance features an international ensemble with Rova saxophonists Larry Ochs, Jon Raskin, Bruce Ackley and Steve Adams (all from California); along with *pianists* Marilyn Crispell (New York) and Chris Brown (California); *contrabassists* Barry Guy (England) and Lisle Ellis (Canada); and *percussionist* William Winnant (California). Every year, the European Community designates one European

city as "the culture capital of Europe." In 1993, this capital was Antwerp, Belgium. The arts festival, Antwerpen 93, presented about 100 concerts from March to December. Many new works were commissioned, but only two from the U.S.A. one the Fifth String Quartet by Elliot Carter, the other Larry Ochs' The Secret Magritte which world-premiered at the festival. The composition is for mixed ensemble and contains written themes that recur in the various orders and overlays and act as springboards for organized improvisation. Each section of the piece maps out territories within which the improvisers are given directions for realizing the music. The opening set is by Rova.



#### Otis Rush

#### June 24 Commodore

"...Otis Rush makes the hair on the back of your neck stand up."– Chicago Tribune Otis Rush is a musical monster. This great Chicago guitarist/vocalist plays his guitar left-handed and upside down (like Jimi Hendrix), and has influenced just about every blues guitarist in the world. Eric Clapton has long acknowledged Rush as a key influence and has recorded many of his songs. The late Stevie Ray Vaughan was a huge Otis disciple who named his group, Double Trouble after a Rush song. Mick Jagger is another notable fan. He recently flew the legendary bluesman into London to perform at his Hammersmith Apollo Blues Show. In concert Otis Rush is sensational. His impassioned vocals and stinging guitar work leave audiences spellbound. On his trademark tunes, All Your Love, So Many Roads, and I Can't Quit You Baby (a huge hit for Led Zeppelin) he can wring more emotion out of a single trilled note than most guitarists pack into an entire solo. A riveting performer, Otis Rush belongs to the great Chicago Blues pantheon that gave us Muddy Waters, Howlin' Wolf, and Little Walter. Don't miss this extremely rare appearance. A double bill with Robben Ford.

Jimmy Scott is a jazz legend with a dreamy, angelic, sweet-sounding tenor voice. 
