







LINCOLN CENTER JAZZ ORCHESTRA WYNTON MARSALIS, CONDUCTOR, TRUMPET

"The LCJO blew the lid off...with a smashing performance...and they swung ferociously." —San Francisco Chronicle Under Wynton Marsalis, the LCJO has revitalized a singular American institution: the jazz big band. The "house band" of Jazz at Lincoln Center, the orchestra's core membership includes some of the world's foremost instrumental soloists and ensemble players. Formed in 1988, the LCJO is dedicated to developing a performance repertoire comprised of historic compositions and newlycommissioned works for jazz orchestra. In addition to pieces by Ellington, Basie and Gillespie, the orchestra's archival repertoire

now includes works by Benny Goodman, Thelonious Monk, Charles Mingus, Gerry Mulligan, Fletcher Henderson, Woody Herman and others. It has also presented world premieres of works commissioned from Benny Carter, Joe Henderson, Freddie Hubbard, Chico O'Farrill and Joe Lovano. The LCJO has embarked on numerous world tours and the group's music is documented on several fine recordings for Columbia/Sony. Wynton Marsalis, the most accomplished and acclaimed jazz artist and composer of his generation, and a distinguished classical musician as well, has been instrumental in bringing jazz to the forefront of American culture by force of his intellect, creativity and charisma. Mr. Marsalis' prominent position in the performing arts pantheon was underscored in April 1997 when he became the first jazz artist to be awarded the prestigious Pulitzer Prize in music. This honour, which for five decades had been the exclusive reserve of classical composers, is just the latest in a series of accolades he has earned throughout the course of his multi-faceted career as a virtuoso instrumentalist, an individualistic composer, an innovative band leader, a Grammy Award-winning recording artist and a dedicated educator. In the words of Mr. Marsalis, "The LCJO will swing as hard as possible at all times." 



Steve Beresford's Signals For Tea

June 27 Vancouver East Cultural Centre Since 1974 London-based multi-instrumentalist/vocalist/composer Steve Beresford has been involved in hundreds of music projects, working across the full spectrum from free improvisa-

tion through jazz-centered material to pop, reggae and MOR songs and on to fully scored music for films and dance. Beresford is perhaps best known—for his early work at least— as a member of the Alterations (with guitarist Peter Cusack and others). He's also worked with The Shaking Ray Levis, Han Bennink, Anthony Braxton, George Lewis, John Zorn, Butch Morris and others. As an arranger and conductor he produced, among other projects, the CD Spirits Rejoice for the



Dedication Orchestra in 1991 and Ixesha in 1994. Steve's Festival project, the songs and music of Signals For Tea is about parody and kitsch, minus the condescension. Writer John Corbett reviewing Signals For Tea on CD in Down Beat said it was "drenched in camp, drawing on different song-form predecessors from cocktail lounge crooning to cowpoke country balladry but [Beresford] approaches the music with genuineness a funny mixture of care and irony—that makes far more durable listening than the average one-joke pastichery." 

Along with fellow New Orleans native Wynton Marsalis, Terence Blanchard ranks as one of the most gifted *trumpeters* on the contemporary jazz scene. His career has taken him from Lionel Hampton's big band, to a four-year stint with Art Blakey's Jazz Messengers, to a five album partnership with sax-

ophonist Donald Harrison. Blanchard has also composed numerous soundtracks including Spike Lee's Crooklyn and Malcolm X and is featured on the score in Kasi Lemmons' film, Eve's Bayou. Most recently the trumpeter has been an explosive member of the Legacy of Art Blakey band which includes Benny Golson, Curtis Fuller, Geoff Keezer and Lewis Nash. His pure tone, rhythmic phrasing, harmonic sophistication and incredible sense of swing confirm Blanchard as one of this decade's great hard bop trumpeters. Blanchard's latest CD is a truly beautiful set of spirituals called Jubilant (Sony). Terence states in the liner notes, "Growing up in the south with a father who studied voice and sang in church has given a passion for these spirituals that has brought me great joy. These spirituals speak to the core of who I am, where I have come from and where I am going." This concert finds Blanchard showcasing some of the great spirituals with his special band—Philip Manuel vocals, Mark Shim tenor saxophone, Edward Simon piano, David Pulphus bass and Troy Davis drums. Jeremy Davenport opens the show.

King, Bo Diddley, Maria Muldaur, Eddie Kendricks, Roger McGuinn and more. Billy received a W.C. Handy Award for Album of the Year for Harp Attack (Alligator) in 1990. In performance, Billy Branch and the Sons of the Blues get everybody rockin' in the party spirit, blowing the blues while serving up tasty dollops of R&B as well as funk. After a recent tour of Asia, Der Spiegel Magazine reported, "When Billy Branch jumped into the audience the Chinese went wild and lost all of their discipline.



They are equally at home in jazz clubs, philharmonic halls, or the back of your car. Led by saxophonist/clarinetist/composer Willem Breuker, the Kollektief plays a hybrid music which cuts across traditional musical lines. The Kollektief's approach combines jazz and "serious" (classical) music with many popular genres, from marching band and circus music to Latin dance steps and music for film and theatre. The result is humourous and often surprising—full of false starts and stops, clean breaks, sudden shifts in musical mood, and above all, a fine sense of irony. The show is also about the nature of language, the power of the word, the danger and the necessity of speaking out. I set 12 poems to music, for Irene to sing. These songs were orchestrated for specific players and instruments. Irene sings in English, and the musicians play, and improvise their own commentary." 

Lhasa

blowing through Mayan ruins."—Calgary Herald With immense theatrical flair, 25 year-old, Montreal-based vocalist Lhasa has won audiences over at iazz and world music festivals across the country. Sales of her CD La Llorona have gone gold in Canada, a feat all the more remarkable because Lhasa sings almost entirely in Spanish. Essentially, she's a singer of Mexican ranchera, an urban tradition from the '30s and '40s characterized by nostalgia and melancholy. What makes the husky-voiced Lhasa unique and exciting is the way she re-interprets the early ranchero traditions through a prism of diverse influences such as Billie Holiday, Tom Waits, Jacques Brel and Maria Callas. The intensity and emotional depth she brings to her material is also auite overwhelmina. The Liorona of Mexican mythology was a siren who seduced men with her sad melodies and lured them to the river's edge where her kiss turned them to stone. This New York-based troupe of musicians, dancers and artisans led by drummer Juan Gutierrez will make you sweat. They use a lot of drums as well as the quatro, a mandolin-like instrument. The melodies are gargeous and the tunes perfectly arranged, precise rhythms making way for singing or a drum section. Their vibrant bomba and plena sounds have roots in the coastal urban barrios of Puerto Rico. The driving energy of these sounds celebrates the group's African heritage and their "Puerto Rican-ness." Since 1983 Los Pleneros de la 21 has performed across the U.S. and Europe, while maintaining roots in New York City. Plena, a style featuring hand-held plena drums, are songs that report and comment on the history of the Puerto Rican people, in a manner often compared to calypso. Percussion is also heard in the cua, guiro, and maraca and instrumentation includes piano and stand-up bass. An evocative, harmonically rich chorus answers the voices of the group's eloquent lead singers. They turn the stage into a community celebration in

On the contemporary blues scene for the past 28 years, it has forged its own distinctive signature "little big band" sound that can rock and stomp or pull off a slow blues simmer and sizzle like nobody else. With its latest release Under One Roof (and two previous Bullseye Blues releases) the ninepiece Roomful sounds stronger than ever. To a crisp horn section, add searing guitar solos, rich and gutsy vocals, great tunes (including stunning originals as well as covers of Willie Dixon and W.C. Clark) and you have one of the most hard-swinging blues bands of all time. Mac Odom vocals, John Rossi drums, Chris Vachon auitar, Al Weisman keyboards, Bob Enos trumpet, John Wolf trombone, Rich Lataille alto/tenor saxes, Kevin May tenor/baritone saxes and Greg Silva bass.



Polwechsel

With one foot in the conservatory and the other in free jazz, the mostly Viennese quartet Polwechsel produces tense compositions of uncanny detail and exciting, unusual textures.
