In this 16th year of the Vancouver International Jazz Festival it gives me great pleasure to reflect on our many accomplishments. The Festival has become one of the most important events of its kind in the world and that is cause for celebration. The Festival and year round concerts have

developed into a strong anchor for the dissemination of creative music not only in Western Canada — but often across Canada and into the United States. Our innovative programming has been recognized internationally and is partly responsible for the global recognition that many of the wonderful musicians in our community have attained. We are primed and ready to delve into the explosive contemporary musical milieu that will surely define the world of jazz and its relatives in the 21st century.



As always the Festival focuses on the most important creators in the jazz and improvised music worlds, presenting a stimulating overview of the current state of the art form.

Some of the most exciting talent in the jazz world will be featured in our theatre series. Make sure not to miss the "Legends of the Bandstand", a wonderful quintet of jazz elders featuring: Hank Jones, Ray Drummond, Gary Bartz, Louis Hayes and Curtis Fuller. Representing the legends to be are Terence Blanchard, Joshua Redman, Roy Hargrove, Chris Potter, Mark Turner/Kurt Rosenwinkel and one of our favourite musicians—award winning trumpeter/composer, Dave Douglas performing in Canada for the very first time with his "New Quintet". Dave is also collaborating in a first time quartet with Louis Sclavis (France), Barre Phillips (USA) and Vancouver's own Dylan van der Schyff.

Our European program features more than a dozen influential bands on the improvised music scene. Undeniably, the centerpiece of the program is British bassist/composer Barry Guy's New Orchestra. Mr. Guy's new project includes a who's who of international all-stars including Marilyn Crispell, Evan Parker, Mats Gustafsson, Herb Robertson, Per Ake Holmlander, Hans Koch, Raymond Strid, Paul Lytton and Johannes Bauer. Ten musicians – from Britain, Germany, Switzerland, USA and Sweden – will perform in a three day extravaganza of mix and match that will be a tonic for adventurous ears. This culminates in the Orchestra concert at the Vancouver East Cultural Centre on June 24.

The NYC downtown scene will provide us with some of the most original musicians playing today: Ellery Eskelin with Andrea Parkins and Jim Black, Tim Berne's Hard Cell and the Paradox Trio. Important Canadian projects by large ensembles include Quebec composer/bassist Normand Guilbeault's controversial — Riel — A Musical Plea in addition to concerts by John Korsrud's Hard Rubber Orchestra. NOW Orchestra and Tony Wilson Nonet.

The new groove component of the Festival has also been kicked up another notch. We'll be showcasing Ninja Tune's Cinematic Orchestra (Britain), Soulive and the John Scofield Band (USA), Ex-Centric Sound System (Israel, Ghana) and great Canadian bands such as Bullfrog featuring Kid Koala, The New Deal, Metalwood and Kevin Breit's Sisters Euclid.

The world music scene is represented by great artists such as Brazil's new bossa stylist Marcio Faraco and percussion dynamos Olodum, Korean/American komungo wizard Jin Hi Kim, percussion virtuoso Trilok Gurtu's new third world ensemble, Cuban greats Barbarito Torres, Ibrahim Ferrer and Rubén González.

It adds up to more music than is imaginable at one of the world's most comprehensive music festivals. Take pride and take advantage of this extraordinary opportunity to explore. It's all yours Vancouver. Enjoy!





"Ball is the bayou queen of the piano, steeped in blues, honky-tonk and gospel. When revved...she's a rollicking dynamo spewing heat-seeking triplets from the ivories while her horn driven band wails. She's also a subtle songwriter and a formidable singer with a wisp of huskiness edging her Cajun-Texan twang." — Minneapolis Star-Tribune

Marcia Ball honed her powerful singing and deft, rollicking keyboard chops while growing up in "the Texas triangle," an area of Louisiana and Texas that spawned greats like Janis Joplin, Johnny Winter, Queen Ida and Zachary Richard. By the early '80s she had signed with Rounder Records and went on to release a slew of dynamite albums - Hot Tamale Baby, Gatorhythms, Let Me Play with Your Poodle and Sing It, a "three divas of the blues" project with Irma Thomas and Tracy Nelson, In 1998, Marcia was honoured with the prestigious W.C. Handy Award for Contemporary Blues Female Artist of the Year Full-tilt or slow burn whatever the musical moment demands - this unabashed powerhouse artist is at home playing roadhouse rock, jumpblues, second line syncopation (à la



Professor Longhair), R&B, deep soul and ballads. In the words of the *Milwaukee Journal*, "She appears to be the secret love child of Miss Manners and Little Richard, sitting demurely at the keyboard while blowing the joint apart." A double bill with Clarence Gatemouth Brown.

With a tone as thick as gumbo and licks as fiery as a tablespoon of cayenne, this blues guitarist may be the hottest thing to come out of Louisiana since chef Paul Prudhomme. His funky, jazzed-up, rhythmic blues are a knock-out!

This international assembly of fantastic musicians led by Dutch pianist/composer Michiel Braam plays some of the coolest modern jazz on the planet. Referencing the music of jazz idols like Monk and Tristano. Braam works in an expanded harmonic idiom that seems to view the music through a prism, starting tunes with a familiar feeling and then taking them apart in oblique ways. Recent CDs include The Second Coolbook and Monk Materials. With Holland's Wilhert de Joode bass, British drummer Martin France and lain Ballamy (of Loose Tubes) on tenor sax, and Germany's Frank Gratkowski, a long-time cohort of Georg Graewe and Gerry Hemingway, on alto sax. An important member of New York City's creative music community, saxophonist Tim Berne's contributions invite comparisons to those of fellow New Yorker John Zorn. Like Zorn, Berne asserts a strong/ and singular musical personality throughout his diverse and frequently absorbing works. Since 1979, Berne has recorded humerous albums for Soul Note, JMT, W&W, Columbia and for his own Empire and Screwgun labels. His collaborators over the years have included Paul Motian, Bill Frisell, Joey Baron, Olu Dara, Mark Dresser and many others. Tim has an instantly identifiable saxophone style (with its skewed R&B sensibility) and a compositional approach that leans toward extended form pieces. His recent projects include the rough and edgy quartet Bloodcount (Michael Formanek, Chris Speed, Jim Black), his improvising trio Paraphrase (Drew Gress, Tom Rainey), the Big Satan trio (Marc Ducret, Tom Rainey) and Hard Cell with keyboard player Craid Taborn (James Carter) and drummer Tom


Terence Blanchard

"Wynton Marsalis may gather the attention, but his fellow New Orleans trumpeter/composer is the mainstream jazzman making the more significant records." – Entertainment Weekly

One of the most gifted trumpeters on the contemporary jazz scene, Blanchard's career has taken him from Lionel Hampton's Big Band, to a four-year stint with Art Blakev's Jazz Messengers, to a fivealbum partnership with saxophonist Donald Harrison. He has also composed numerous soundtracks including Spike Lee's Mo'Better Blues and Malcolm X and is featured on the upcoming soundtrack for Things You Can Tell By Looking At Her (Sony Classical). Blanchard's debut CD on Sony Classical was the criticallyacclaimed Jazz in Film, a project that celebrated the powerful encounters between jazz and classic movie scores such as Anatomy of a Murder (Duke Ellington), Chinatown (Jerry Goldsmith) and The Pawnbroker (Quincy Jones). His second release for Sony Classical, Wandering Moon, is a quietly dazzling set of original compositions featuring guests Branford Marsalis and Dave Holland. Lately. Terence and his stellar band have been tearing it up in jazz clubs throughout New York City. With his pure tone, rhythmic phrasing, harmonic sophistication and incredible white-hot sense of swing, Blanchard is one of the greatest hard bop trumpeters in jazz. Brice Winston tenor sax, Edward Simon piano, Derek Nievergelt bass and Eric Harland drums.



Bloomdaddies

This funky groove-based New York jazz quintet, led by ferociously talented saxophonist and former Vancouverite Seamus Blake, boasts an unorthodox lineup of Blake and Chris Cheek electric saxophones, Tony Mason and Dan Reiser drums, and Tim Luntzel electric bass and vocals. Combining grooves and beats with tight melodic lines and a deep, funky bass, the Bloomdaddies' music is too cool. They have two CDs, The Bloomdaddies and Racer X, and a brand new release coming out on New York's Fresh Sound label.

Guitarist/composer Kevin Breit is one of the most prolific artists around. He has recorded and toured with Holly Cole, k.d, lang, Grammy-winner Cassandra Wilson and many others. He also performs and records (Supergenerous, Blue Note) with Brazilian percussionist Cyro Baptista in an all-improvised duo setting in New York City. Toronto's Sisters Euclid, led by the amazing Breit, treats audiences to a repertoire that ranges from modern jazz, tock, bluegrass, hip-hop to the occasional show tune. Described as a "carnival garage band," Sisters Euclid has released three acclaimed recordings including the latest *Emily Gunfighter*. This show is not be missed!







The brilliantly named Cinematic Orchestra from the UK is led by composer/ sampler/multi-instrumentalist Jason Swinscoe who formed his first group, Crabladder in 1990. After the group's demise in the mid-'90s he started recording on his own. 
Since moving to New York City in the early '80s, full-bodied, postmodern tenor saxophonist/composer Ellery Eskelin has performed in a wide variety of musical settings. Founded by Israeli bassist/guitarist/sampler Yossi Fine (David Bowie, Stanley Jordan, Me'Shell Ndegéocello), Ex-centric Sound System provides the missing link between African, Latin, Caribbean, and African-American music fusing traditional African styles with modern club sounds. The partnership of musicians with Israeli, Ghanaian, West Indian, and Moroccan heritage has created a hypnotizing, charismatic sound. They use such diverse instruments as African thumb piano, Ethiopian harp, wooden xylophones, flutes and stripped-down funky bass and trap drums to accompany vocals in Ghanaian, Ethiopian, English and Rwandan. The result is a highly original sound made up of circular rhythms, dance beats, electronics, vocals layered over West African percussion, and dubbed-out Ethiopian and Ghanaian chants. 

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



Parker/Guy/Lytton/Crispell

The British improvising trio of Evan Parker saxophones, Barry Guy bass and Paul Lytton drums will be joined by special quest,

American pianist Marilyn Crispell. Evan Parker, a major force in European improvised music for over 30 years, is known for outstanding musicianship and massive technique (especially in his use of circular breathing). Parker has toured extensively, both solo and with a variety of groups, and has recorded for many labels including Incus (which he co-founded), Metalanguage, Leo, Maya and Germany's FMP. He has performed/recorded with Cecil Taylor, Anthony Braxton, Charlie Watts Big Band, The London Jazz Composer's Orchestra. Derek Bailey and countless others. Drummer Paul Lytton treats his instruments as a canvas, combining both muted and brilliant colours. He works on the micro sound level, extracting subtle and unexpected sounds. He too has appeared on numerous recordings on FMP, Maya and Leo. The trio combines the languages of free jazz and 20th century classical music, exploring both conventional and unconventional sounds in a completely improvised setting. The resulting music packs an emotional power comparable to that of late Coltrane. Pianist Marilyn Crispell primarily discovered jazz through the music of John Coltrane, Cecil Taylor and Paul Bley. She is probably best known for her decade as a member of the Anthony Braxton Quartet. But Marilyn has also distinguished herself as a brilliant solo artist and ensemble player with such notable artists as Reggie Workman, Oliver Lake, Roscoe Mitchell, Gerry Hemingway and Steve Lacy. Crispell has recorded extensively as a leader and in collaboration with others, on such labels as ECM, Leo,

Swiss reedman Hans Koch is recognized as one of the most significant and adventurous improvisers on the European scene. His long-standing trio with cellist Martin Schutz and percussionist Fredy Studer generates a rich amalgam of jazz, classical and folk forms. 



Buddy Guy is one of the most exciting and prolific artists in contemporary blues. Hailed as one of the best quitarists in the world by Jimi Hendrix, Eric Clapton and the Rolling Stones. Guy has won four Grammy Awards and been nominated for two others, selling millions of records in the process. A natural showman and a flashy, virtuoso quitarist. Buddy led the second generation of Chicago blues. The Louisiana native emigrated north in 1957. Within a couple of years, he was employed as a session player at the legendary Chess Records studios. Serving as apprentice to blues masters like Muddy Waters and Howlin' Wolf, Buddy Guy absorbed their lessons. As a solo act, he brought the gritty, raw sound of Chicago into the psychedelic '60s. A fixture on the New York music scene for the last 17 years, guitarist/composer John Hart has distinguished himself as a recording artist and bandleader. From grooving swing (he's played with Hammond B3 organ master Jack McDuff) to contemporary jazz (Terumasa Hino, Javon Jackson, Randy Brecker), Hart plays with





Irakere has come to define the possibilities of combining Afro-Cuban rhythms and modern jazz with a fusion that's as sophisticated as it is powerful and danceable. Relentless energy has been one of the hallmarks of the group from its early days with Paguito D'Rivera, Arturo Sandoval and Chucho Valdes, D'Rivera and Sandoval left years ago and co-founding member/musical director/pianist Valdes isn't touring with the current group, yet his muscular mark is still apparent. Barharito Torres

He's back for an encore performance following his sensational concert at last year's Jazz Festival. The amazing Barbarito Torres is widely regarded as one of Cuba's greatest *lute* players. He has remained true to the musical folklore of

his native region, the genre known as musica quajira, or the "blues" of the Cuban countryside. The New York Times compared him to Chuck Berry, but, as Barbarito's recent recording Havana Café (Atlantic) reveals, the virtuoso could also be called the Hank Williams of Cuban music. Torres first came to the attention of Canadian music fans in 1997 as part of the Grammy-winning Buena Vista Social Club. He is an intoxicating performer who ioins Cuban artists such as the Afro-Cuban All-Stars, Ibrahim Ferrer, Jesus Alemany (Cubanismo), who have all enriched our musical culture with an old, deep and rich art form. He'll appear with a fantastic seven-piece band. On a double bill with the remarkable Brazilian quitarist/vocalist Marcio Faraco.



Since first meeting in the late '80s at the Berklee School of Music, saxophonist Mark Turner and *guitarist* Kurt Rosenwinkel have often worked together, playing in each other's bands, performing on each other's albums and drawing from the same pool of side musicians. Rosenwinkel is a dazzling young player who guitar master John Scofield calls "one of the finest and most creative jazz guitarists playing today." His music - an amalgam of swing, post-bop, pop and funk full of harmonic and rhythmic detours but with a driving momentum manages to be smart and energetic. He first gained attention in the early '90s as a member of Paul Motian's Electric Bebop Band and has since performed/recorded with Tim Hagans and Brian Blade and Human Feel, Rosenwinkel has released two solo CDs on Verve. The Enemies of Energy and The Next Step. Mark Turner possesses one of the boldest, most captivating sax sounds around. His solos combine the seemingly disparate styles of John Coltrane and Warne Marsh into something new. He has released three Warner albums as a leader while appearing prominently in the bands of Terence Blanchard, Dave Douglas and John Patittuci. With Ben Street hass. Eric McPherson drums.

Kenny Werner Trio

Kenny Werner is one of jazz's singular voices. A brilliant *pianist* and celebrated author and clinician, he has developed a style all his own, fusing the music's many trajectories into a strikingly conceived whole. Throughout the '80s and '90s, Werner played with a variety of famed jazz artists from John Abercrombie and Joe Henderson to Dave Holland and Jack De Johnette. One of his strongest alliances, however, was with saxophonist Joe Lovano, with whom he recorded several albums. Kenny produced a series of acclaimed records in the '90s including a solo album called Live at Maybeck Hall (Concord) which is

considered a bellwether for contemporary pianists. His current CD. Beauty Secrets (RCA), is one of Werner's most ambitious projects to date. His piano is featured in settings ranging from a standard jazz piano trio configuration to selections with violin, strings, quintet with horns, vocalist and spoken word. A virtuoso with a vivid imagination, Werner's two previous Festival appearances, one with Joe Lovano's Quintet, (where he literally stole the show), and more recently an extremely moving duo concert with harmonica master Toots Thielemans, have provided endless subiect matter for local music aficionados. 


Wide Mouth Mason

The three young men in this powerhouse band grew up together, attended the same high school in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan and played together in various incarnations. They formed Wide Mouth Mason in 1995 and breathed new life into the blues-rock trio concept pioneered by their heroes Jimi Hendrix and Buddy Guy. After signing with Warner, Wide Mouth Mason released their selftitled major label debut recording in 1997. This joyous outpouring of rock, funk, blues, soul and pop influences produced the top ten radio and video hits Midnight Rain, My Old Self and This Mourning. In 1999 they followed with Where I Started which featured the hit single Why. They've won numerous awards along the way, including a 1998





JUNO nomination for Best New Group. The trio — *guitarist/vocalist* Shaun Verreault, *bassist* Earl Pereira and *drummer* Safwan Javed — excels at performing live, opening for ZZ Top, George Thorogood and respected Canadian band Big Sugar. At a recent edition of the Montreux Jazz Festival (Switzerland) Wide Mouth Mason jammed with Me'shell Ndegéocello and Joshua Redman and impressed Van Morrison so much that he asked Verreault to join him on stage.

Tony Wilson

Guitarist/bandleader/composer Wilson is a major force in our city's creative music community. In demand as a collaborator with local artists like Peggy Lee and François Houle, he's also worked with Myra Melford, Vinny Golia, and others.
