
At 73-years of age, Mississippi-born singer/songwriter/pianist Mose Allison is celebrating his 52nd anniversary of performing. Influenced by jazz musicians including Nat Cole, Bud Powell, John Lewis and Al Haig, Allison moved to New York in 1956 and found work in the bands of Stan Getz, Zoot Sims and Gerry Mulligan before launching his own trio in the late '50s. With swinging piano lines rem-

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iniscent of Lester Yound's saxophone style and down-home lyrics teeming with irony and wisdom. Allison recorded his cabaret-from-the-backwoods brand of folky jazz for such labels as Prestige, Atlantic and Blue Note. A truly legendary figure, Mose Allison is well-established as a great American songwriter whose laconic, insightful songs have informed generations of other singers and songwriters. And it hasn't been just jazz musicians who have benefitted. Mose has influenced a broad spectrum of popular artists, blues musicians, beboppers and vocalists of every stripe. Bonnie Raitt, Van Morrison and Elvis Costello have covered such Mose classics as Everybody's Crvin' Mercy, Hello There Universe and Your Mind is On Vacation. Allison's latest CD. The Mose Chronicles (Blue Note) is a funfilled live session recorded in London. This unique artist's popularity continues to grow after more than 50 years of steady output. Alma Libre

Sensational music. Spanish for "free soul"—this dynamic Vancouver group, formed by guitarists Martin Simpson and André Stephen, performs in the *nuevo flamenco* tradition. With the release of their extremely successful self-titled debut CD, the band has been in great demand. They opened the '95 Vancouver festival, and performed with the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra in '97. Lotte Anker/Marilyn Crispell

Danish saxophonist/composer/improviser Lotte Anker is primarily influenced by the music of John Coltrane and Wayne Shorter but also the experimental Scandinavian jazz scene of the early '80s. Over the last 20 years she's performed in a wide range of groups such as Marilyn Mazur's Primi Band, Pierre Dorge's Subway Music, the Maria Schneider Big Band, and Barry Guy + Av-Art Orchestra. She currently co-leads the 12-piece Copenhagen Art Ensemble performing new music and collaborating with artists like Tim Berne, Django Bates and the Zapolski Quartet, In 1997, Anker formed a new group, Sine Die, with Marilyn Crispell, Arve Hendriksen, Anders Jormin and Raymond Strid and a new trio with Crispell and Marilyn Mazur. As an improviser and composer. Lotte's main interests are in the realms of free improv jazz, contemporary classical and the combination of the two. Pianist Marilyn Crispell discovered jazz through the music of Coltrane, Cecil Taylor and Paul Bley. She is probably best-known for her decade as a member of the Anthony Braxton Quartet. But Marilyn has also distinguished herself as a brilliant solo artist and ensemble player with such notable artists as Reggie Workman, Oliver Lake, Roscoe Mitchell, Gary Peacock and Steve Lacy. Crispell has recorded extensively as a leader and in collaboration with others, on such labels as ECM, Leo, Alice and Music & Arts. Crispell and Anker along with percussionist Marilyn Mazur have recently released a terrific trio CD called *Poetic Justice* (Dacapo). *Thanks to the Danish Jazz Federation and the Danish Music Council.*



Antibalas Afrobeat Orchestra

June 26 Commodore



Antibalas (Spanish for "bulletproof:" literally "anti-bullets") is the next generation of Afrobeat. They follow in the tradition of the Black President, Fela Anikulapo-Kuti, uniting Nigerian highlife, jazz, funk and traditional African elements with unabashed political messages. This Brooklyn-based 15-piece band hits hard with the left and the right-monstrous horns and bass layered over funky polyrhythmic beats and breaks coupled with furious lyrics inciting insurrection in English, Yoruba and Spanish. Formed in 1998 by members of Desco Records' Soul Providers and the Daktaris, they were quickly joined by like-minded musicians in the worlds of jazz, rock, improvised music, and traditional drumming from Cuba and Brazil. Pretty soon they were playing New York clubs like SOB's and the Knitting Factory, hosting regular weekend parties called Africalia. Led by baritone saxophonist Martin Antibalas, this union of



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Latinos, Caucasians, African-Americans and Asian-Americans "defies history," as the *San Francisco Bay Guardian* reported, "They retain a third-worldist view that is both refreshingly oppositional and hopelessly nostalgic." Their credo seems to be "all nations under Afrobeat." Look for the band's Ninja Tune CDs, *Talkatif* and *Liberation Afro Beat Vol.* 1 and while you're at it pick up some good dancing shoes.

Masa J. Anzai

Vancouver-born alto saxophonist Masa J. Anzai is a new force on our city's creative music scene. Leader of several dynamic projects that incorporate electronics, improvisation and noise, he'll appear at this Festival in a number of bands and collaborations, including Barking Sphinx Ensemble, Smoke Rings, Free Energy Band and Almost Transparent Blue. When former Vancouverite, saxophonist/composer Rob Armus moved to Amsterdam in 1992, he soon established a reputation as a strong soloist and collaborator on the improvised music scene. His newest project, Aros, based on his musical partnership with Austrian classical pianist Marion von Tilzer, was formed with the objective of combining jazz and improvised music with classical and new music forms. The band performs Armus' and von Tilzer's original compositions and it's not unusual to hear tango, jazz, old and new music and African rhythms mixing with improvisation. 


ents the latest installment of exciting and creative new jazz from Budge Wesseltoft's adventurous Oslo-based Jazzland label. One of the key bands of the "new wave" of Scandinavian jazz currently attracting much press attention, Atomic brings together five important young musicians from the burgeoning jazz underground of Sweden and Norway. Formed in the spring of 1999, they quickly forged a strong group identity without sacrificing individual freedom of expression. Combining the powerful, cutting edge Oslo rhythm section of Haavard Wiik on piano, Ingebrigt Håker-Flaten on bass and Paal Nilssen-Love on drums-a combination that received rave notices as the rhythm team of the Coltrane-influenced "cult" group Element-with the Stockholm front-line of trumpeter Magnus Broo and saxophonist Fredrik Liunkvist, this group is one of the freshest acoustic ensembles to have emerged in the new millennium. Atomic plays original music that mixes a distinctive approach to free playing with grooves and modes. Their interplay and ability to take the music in new and interesting directions has resulted in musical collaborations with a variety of leading contemporary jazz musicians including Chris Potter from the U.S.A., lain Ballamy from the U.K., the Fin Jukka Perko and the Swede Per "Texas" Johansson, Thanks to the Norwegian Jazz Association. 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Ab Baars Trio



This is one of the most exceptional trios from the lively improvised Dutch music scene. Saxophonist Ab Baars has extracted a musical language from American bop and free jazz and 20th century composers like Stravinsky and Messiaen that reflects deep intelligence and a guirky sense of humour. The trio, which includes percussionist Martin van Duvnhoven and bassist Wilbert de Joode, has plaved together for years and it shows. This extraordinary group speaks as three individuals with one voice. Their Western Front performance finds them playing North American Indian songs (see disc on Geestgronden), Francois Houle will appear with the trio playing the music of John Carter. And the trio will be augmented by Houle and Peggy Lee to perform Baar's 22 Improvisations Project. Wilbert de Joode will also be performing with van der Schyff and Brad Turner at the Vogue (June 23) and will appear as a quest with The Electricks (June 24). Thanks to the Dutch Fonds voor de Podiumkunsten and the Dutch Embassy Ottawa. During a remarkable career spanning 50 years, legendary British trombonist/composer/bandleader Chris Barber has made over 10.000 concert appearances and recorded more than 100 albums. In the 1950s, he was one of the leaders of England's trad jazz movement. Always a hot Dixieland player, Barber has long been open-minded toward ragtime, swing, mainstream, blues and rhythm & blues. He's collaborated with a who's who of musical luminaries including Muddy Waters, Louis Jordan, Dr. John and Van Morrison. Along with Lonnie Donnegan, Barber was a creator of the Skiffle movement that inspired a generation of pop giants like John Lennon and Eric Clapton to pick up their first guitars. Barbers' passion for blues and trad jazz is as strong today as ever and it's this passion which led him to collaborate with Vancouver's Sweet Papa Lowdown, After hearing SPL's first recording, Lost and Found several years ago, Barber contacted the band's leader/vocalist/guitarist Jeff Shucard to suggest a future collaboration. 

"-Michael Ondaatie This Festival has a history of presenting a broad and challenging artistic program that transcends the boundaries of mainstream jazz, blues and improvised music and breaks new ground in the world of creative music. In keeping with this genre-stretching tradition, we are proud to collaborate with the CBC Radio Orchestra to present the music of Gavin Bryars. This marks the Festival's first presentation of orchestral works by a major contemporary composer. Mr. Bryars and the CBC Radio Orchestra will be joined by three diverse and extraordinary artists-jazz/pop vocalist Holly Cole, violinist Gwen Hoebig, and conductor Owen Underhill.

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A remarkable musician and composer. Gavin Brvars established his musical reputation in the early 1960s as a jazz bassist working with fellow English improvisers Derek Bailey and Tony Oxley. He went on to work with such influential composers as John Cage, Cornelius Cardew and John White, Bryars has composed for the theatre and dance as well as for the concert hall and has written two full-length operas. Among his works are commissions for Charlie Haden Nexus, Balanescu Quartet, Bournemouth Sinfonietta, BBC Symphony Orchestra and Primavera Chamber Orchestra, Bill Frisell, Evan Parker and other notable jazz and improv artists have performed his works. Among his numerous recordings Jesus' Blood Never Failed Me Yet (Point) featuring Tom Waits and The Sinking of the Titanic have been hugely successful.

Canadian vocalist Holly Cole is known internationally for her imaginative, distinctive interpretations of standards, show tunes and popular songs. Cole's palette of vocal textures and expression makes for a compelling and provocative approach to her eclectic material. Recognized as one of Canada's most outstanding violinists, Vancouver native Gwen Hoebig is celebrated for her interpretations of new music. She has given the Canadian premieres of violin concertos by Joan Tower, Christopher Rouse, Philip Glass and Garv Kulesha.

Former Artistic Director of the Vancouver New Music Society, Owen Underhill has made conducting appearances with the Manitoba Chamber Orchestra, the Vancouver Symphony and the National Arts Centre, in addition to frequent performances with the CBC Radio Orchestra and the Vancouver New Music Ensemble. The only remaining studio radio orchestra in North America, the CBC Radio Orchestra is renowned for its commitment to the work of contemporary composers and for performing a repertoire outside the classical cannon.

During this extraordinary concert the compositions of Gavin Bryars will speak to the arbitrary distinctions between such stylistic classifications as "jazz" and "new music." Multi award-winning saxophonist/flutist Jane Bunnett from Toronto is known for her pioneering work forging jazz with Cuban folkloric roots music. Since the release of her landmark recording Spirits of Havana ten years ago, Cuban music has undergone a huge resurgence of popularity. Witness the Buena Vista Social Club phenomenon. Recently, Roy Hargrove, Steve Coleman and Marilyn Lerner have recorded in Havana, reminding us of the long affair between modern jazz and Cuban music that began with Dizzy Gillespie. For the new recording Alma De Santiago (EMI) Bunnett returned to the Cuban city, Santiago de Cuba, that first kindled her passionate interest in the music of the island back in the early 1980s. There, she and her husband trumpeter Larry Cramer recruited 17-year-old piano wonder David Virelles, the Santiago Jazz Saxophone Quartet, legendary sonero Eduardo "Tiburon" Morales, son group Los Jubilados, the 38-strong percussion troupe Los Hoyos and longtime co-conspirator bassist. Roberto Occhipinti to create a wonderful album that seamlessly blends son, conga, bolera and mambo with bebop and modern jazz. The results are magnificent. singer-songwriter/quitarist who lives in New York, hangs out with musical globetrotters like David Byrne and Arto Lindsay and writes jazz-inflected pop tunes in his native Portuguese. While his breezy melodies and mostly acoustic arrangements echo the spirit of his bossa nova forerunners (he cites Antonio Carlos Jobim, Chet Baker and Bill Evans as key influences), it's evident the sounds of New York have seeped into his music. On Vinicius (Transparent Music) he draws on musical collaborators who pull together strands of classicism and boundary-pushing experiments-quitarists Marc Ribot and Bill Frisell, pianist Brad Mehldau, and drummer Joev Baron among them. The resulting music is eclectic and moody, but smooth as silk, at times reminiscent of maestro Caetano Veloso, with whom Cantuaria toured for ten years. Brazilian musicians have a history of revering their own traditions even as they depart from them. Vinicius Cantuaria ably expands on this legacy. James Carter burst onto the scene in the mid-'90s with several sensational recordings for labels DIW and Atlantic. He has the ability to play in any jazz style. Whether it be slap-tongue staccato of early '20s tenors, Dixieland, swing, bop, 1950s R&B, free form or funk, Carter maintains his own identity. His musical prowess and versatility have landed him gigs with Wynton Marsalis, Lester Bowie, Charles Mingus Big Band and the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra. 



With additional use of electronics, the duo often sound like a larger band. DeJohnette's electronic percussion allows him to add a bass line from time to time, or to simulate the sounds of congas, tabla and tympani. Surman's synthesizers, meanwhile, add spaciousness and depth to the instrumental texture. The individual achievements of DeJohnette and Surman are staggering. 





Bassist extraordinare, composer, bandleader, teacher, and Grammy Award-winner Charlie Haden is no stranger to Latin music. It was Haden who, in 1969, founded the Liberation Music Orchestra, a visionary outfit that combined adventurous jazz with both Spanish and Cuban influences. His new Verve recording Nocturne demonstrates that the veteran acoustic bassist is capable of finding new things to say in the Latin realm. Produced with the acclaimed Cuban-born pianist Gonzalo Rubalcaba, Nocturne marks the first time Haden has devoted an entire album to *boleros*-the sensuous, romantic ballads that have moved Latin America for generations. It was also an opportunity to show non-Latin listeners how great the songs of Marta Valdes, Martin Rojas and other great Latino composers are. For Haden and Rubalcaba. Nocturne is the latest chapter in an enduring friendship. Rubalcaba was only 23 when he first met Haden at the Havana Jazz Festival in 1986. Haden quickly became one of Rubalcaba's strongest supporters helping him land gigs in North America and convincing Blue Note Records to sign him in the early '90s. Not surprisingly, Haden was Rubalcaba's number one choice when in 1991, he needed a bassist for his first Blue Note studio date, The Blessing. For Nocturne Haden and Rubal-



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
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Ahmad Jamal June 23 Vogue Theatre

Things flow in and out of each other...He knocked me out with his concept of space, his lightness of touch, his understatement and the way he phrased notes and chords and passages...I loved his lyricism on piano, the way he played and the spacing he used in the ensemble voicing of his groups...Ahmad is one of my favorites. One of the subtlest virtuosos of jazz piano, Ahmad Jamal's uncanny use of space in his playing and leadership of his small ensembles have been hallmarks of his influential career. Among those he most influenced was Miles Davis. Miles made numerous and prominent mentions of Jamal's influence, particularly in his use of space and his choice of compositions. Several tunes that were on Jamal's playlist, such as the standard Autumn Leaves and Jamal's own New Rhumba, began appearing on the playlist of Davis' 1950s bands. Additionally, Jamal's textured rhythms on piano influenced Davis' piano players as well, from Wynton Kelly in the 1950s to Herbie Hancock in the 1960s. In 1956, Jamal formed his famous trio with Israel Crosby and drummer Vernell Fournier. The threesome went on to enjoy huge success with the 1958 album Live At The Pershing (Argo) becoming a smash hit. Forty years later, Jamal remains the masterful arranger with the brilliant orchestral mind who coaxes from the trio format a lushness of texture that is both dazzling and stirring. A musical





Llorca's music has a warmth and natural looseness that belie his 27 years. Growing up in a small town near Paris, he constantly listened to the disco and club music that his mother brought home. His father, a computer enthusiast, gave his young son his first computer, a Commodore 64. While figuring out how to be a teen techno junkie in a small French town, he met David Duriez, a huge fan of techno music. He and Duriez formed the label Brique Rouge and began releasing their own productions, variations on the theme of funky French house. 

Pat Martino Trio featuring Joey DeFrancesco

Hot grooves and energetic swing power this amazing trio! Co-led by legendary quitarist Pat Martino and Hammond B-3 whiz Joey DeFrancesco these guys produce more heat than a Don Cherry rant on Hockey Night in Canada. An icon before his 18th birthday, Pat Martino was signed as a leader for Prestige Records when he was 20. His seminal albums from this period (the late '60s) include classics like Strings!, Desperado, El Hombre and Baivina. Martino also immersed himself in the "soul jazz" of the day, gigging with such giants as Jack McDuff, Charles Farland Don Patterson. Sonny Stitt and Gene Ammons, In 1980, after surgery to correct a potentially fatal brain aneurysm, Martino recovered only to discover he had lost his memory and completely forgot how to play. It took years but he regained his ability, partly by listening to his old records. Today, at 57, Pat Martino is once again considered one of the greatest guitarists in the world. His recent CD Live at Yoshi's (Blue Note) with Joev DeFrancesco and drummer Billy Hart, marks a return to the same organ-trio style with which the Philadelphia native first made his name 40 years ago. Pat's partner Joey DeFrancesco is arguably the greatest Hammond B-3 organ player in the world. Influenced by Jimmy Smith and Larry Young, Joey has developed a sound all his own. He swings ferociously, executes spot-on single note lines with imaginative bass lines underneath them, and can dig deep in the pocket or float over the time. Down Beat magazine recently compared his swinging organ playing to

"a ten on the Richter scale." Joev has released over a dozen recordings as a leader and has worked with Miles Davis John Scofield, John McLaughlin and others This show will be a scorcher! With Byron Landrum drums.

One of Canada's biggest musical success stories began in 1997 when four young musicians, two from Vancouver, one from Toronto, and one from New York, discovered their shared passion for electric Miles Davis, the Headhunters, Weather Report and Return To Forever. That fall in Vancouver, the four got together for a session, then a gig that same night, and then headed into the recording studio. Metalwood was born. Their first eponymous album won the 1998 JUNO for Best Contemporary Jazz Recording, and Metalwood 2 took home the same award in 2001. Since then bassist Chris Tarry. drummer lan Froman, trumpeter/kevboardist Brad Turner and saxophonist Mike Murley have been an unstoppable force, recording a series of increasingly exciting, sophisticated and outright swinging albums. 

This is most evident on his brilliant solo recording Everything in Stages (Songlines) where Stride-like or blues-tinged passages merge into free playing. Paul's global musical associations include works with Cecil Taylor, Barry Guy, Trichy Sankaran, Joey Baron and William Parker. At the 2000 Festival Paul and the CBC Badio Orchestra performed a piano concerto written for Plimley by composer Mark Armanini. Vancouver-based Travis Baker's bass plaving reflects his interest in avant garde jazz, contemporary classical music and the raw energy of punk rock. As an improviser, he draws on these diverse elements to create a unified personal vocabulary. Whether in solo performance, in duo with bassoonist Sara Schoenbeck, or with his various ensemble projects (Meathook Ensemble, Little Stitches), Baker is a gutsy, authoritative voice. American drummer/percussionist Gerry Hemingway is one of the most dynamic and inventive players in the world. He was a longtime member of the Anthony Braxton Quartet and now leads his own groups. 
Dianne Reeves

From Ethel Waters to Ella Fitzgerald, Sarah Vaughan and Carmen McRae Dianne Reeves is the legitimate extension of all the great jazz *singers* who preceded her. With her strong, multi-octave voice, rhythmic virtuosity, and improvisational ease, Dianne was clearly born of jazz. But music, she feels should have "no boundaries," so her singing draws upon a world of influences: Africa, Brazil, the Caribbean, gospel and pop. A Blue Note recording artist since 1987, Reeves recently won a Grammy Award for her ninth album, *The Calling: Celebrating Sarah Vaughan*, a tribute to the esteemed





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vocalist who inspired her to pursue the art of singing. In a review of the CD the *New York Times* wrote, "Ms. Reeves stays perfectly on pitch, and her notes, individually packaged like Valentine chocolates, have a perfect roundness. Like Sarah Vaughan she has the technique that you don't really miss in other singers until you hear her perform." But the greatest tribute to Dianne's artistry comes from the leg-

But the greatest tribute to Dianne's artistry comes from the legendary musicians she's worked with— Clark Terry, Sergio Mendes, Harry Belafonte, McCoy Tyner—who have actively championed her. 

Ken Vandermark's School Days

Ken Vandermark may be the most prominent young reed player on the American avant scene. A recent recipient of the MacArthur "Genius" Award, he has collaborated with many of Chicago's seminal musicians as well as a whole crop of new improvisers who are restoring Chicago to prominence as a free jazz hot spot. Thanks to his energetic involvement in a series of projects including the NRG Ensemble, Caffeine, Signal to Noise Unit, Witches and Devils and more. Vandermark is the key figure in Chicago's improvisational community, By 1997, Ken had decided to focus his attention on three bands-the Vandermark 5 (founded in 1996 with saxophonist Mars Williams, trombonist Jeb Bishop, bassist Kent Kessler and drummer Tim Mulvenna); the DVK Trio with percussionist Hamid Drake and Kessler; and Steam with Kessler, Mulvenna and pianist Jim Baker. Acknowledged for a huge sound that synthesizes bop, free improv and blues elements. Vandermark has also worked with an international array of musicians including German saxophonist Peter Brötzmann, French bassist Joelle Leandre and Swedish saxophonist Mats Gustafsson. He has recorded over 40 CDs, many on OKKA disc. Taking its name from a famous 1960s recording by the Steve Lacy/Roswell Rudd Quartet, School Days is one of Ken's latest projects. Reprising the Lacy/Rudd frontline (with himself on sax and fellow Chicago musician Jeb Bishop on trombone), Vandermark has added the heavyweight Scandinavian rhythm section of Kjell Nordeson vibes, Ingebigt Håker-Flaten bass and Paal Nilsssen-Love drums for a potent collaboration. Kenny Werner's music is sublime. A brilliant pianist and celebrated author and clinician, he has developed a style all his own, fusing the music's many trajectories into a strikingly conceived whole. Throughout the '80s and '90s, Werner played with a variety of famed jazz artists from John Abercrombie and Joe Henderson to Dave Holland and Jack DeJohnette. One of his strongest alliances was with saxophonist Joe Lovano, with whom he recorded several albums. Kenny produced a series of acclaimed recordings including a sensational solo album called Live at Maybeck Hall (Concord) which is considered a hellwether for contemporary pianists. Kenny's latest album is a live trio session. Form and Fantasy (NBR), that simultaneously swings like crazy while rendering some heartbreakingly beautiful arrangements. A virtuoso with a vivid imagination. Werner's three previous Festival appearances, one with Joe Lovano's Quintet (where he literally stole the show), an extremely moving duo concert with harmonica master Toots Thielemans, and last year's ecstatic trio performance have made him an indispensable, much talked about, mustsee performer. Kenny's trio includes Johannes Weidenmueller bass, Ari Hoenig drums. Werner performs a second concert with one of Canada's most prominent jazz artists. Vancouver-based trumpeter Brad Turner and his trio featuring André Lachance bass and Dylan van der Schvff drums. Brad is a JUNO-award winner who's performed with Joe Lovano, John Scofield and Kurt Elling, while co-leading the electric jazz group Metalwood. His trio performs hard-hitting originals and seldom-played standards. A third setting will find Kenny Werner jamming with the NiteCap band.

He's gone from ECM Nordic jazz traditions (playing and recording with the likes of Jan Garbarek and Terje Rypdal) to forming his own exquisite label, Jazzland, and creating a unique, fresh sound dubbed "future jazz." What sets Jazzland's music apart is the way it embraces the liberating potential of dance music-mixing and matching European techno, drum 'n' bass. house, ambient and jazz improvisation in a way that clicks with club culture yet is welcomed by open-minded jazz fans. Since the release of his Norwegian "Grammy" Award-winning debut CD, New Conception of Jazz in '97 (followed by Sharing in '98), Bugge has toured the world's melting-pot festivals where jazz meets dance culture and has seen his

Chick Corea and Erik Satie, while finding an impressive following among some of the world's most respected DJ glitterati: Gilles Peterson, Mixmaster Morris and José Padilla. Bugge's latest recording Moving is a perfect document of his new world order of jazz. 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
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
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
