Founded in 1987, this orchestra from Vancouver, Canada, has continuously transformed itself over its 25 years of existence, reaching one of its high points in The Shadowgraph Series, dedicated to the compositions of the virtuoso trombone player and composer George Lewis, a Chicago legend who started out at the Association for the Advancement of Creative Music (AACM).


