The Winter Roots Music Festival presents the best of Vancouver's folk music as well as the sounds of Africa, Japan, China, the Caribbean and the fabulous singing and songs of England's Clive Gregson and Christine Collister.

It starts tonight at the Vancouver East Cultural Centre. The festival is such an


obvious idea — a terrific way to thaw our cold spell and fill a musical void — it's surprising no one thought of it before.

However, it has taken last year's formation of the Acoustic Connection Music and Cultural Society, which unites six different folk organizations, to co-ordinate and mobilize the home-town folk community.

The Winter Roots Festival takes place at both the VECC (1895 Venables) and the WISE Club (around the corner at 1882 Adanac). Tonight's bill features Stephen Fearing, Francis Xavier, Takeo Yamashiro and the UBC Chinese Music Ensemble.

Tomorrow the Cultch hosts Bill Henderson, Shari Ulrich and Roy (Bim) Forbes with John McLachlan and Canadian Sky, Sam Weis and the Shaman Society Singers while the WISE Club has Mango Dub in a late show starting at 11 p.m.

Saturday begins with mini-concerts and workshops at the WISE Club from 11 in the morning. That evening at 7:30 p.m., Gregson and Collister are at the Cultch with Natural Elements, African Heritage and Eileen McGann. The late-night cabaret presents The Nyetz.







There are more workshops and performances at the WISE Club on Sunday afternoon to 5 p.m., when Spirit Of the West and square-dance troupe No Mean Feet take over. Spirit Of the West is back at the WISE Club at 8 p.m. with the Sunday Umbrella Band, which will host an old-fashioned Ceilidh.
