

The Vogue Series (9pm) is stellar. Grammy award winning singer / bassist Esperanza Spalding finally makes her first appearance with us: world music sensation Red Baraat (the buzz band at SXSW2013) will rock their north Indian bhangra rhythms on a double bill with Gordon Grdina's excellent Haram. We're also very excited about contemporary jazz legend David Murray's Infinity Quartet featuring the utterly unique vocals of Macy Gray. The comeback stories of seasoned rhythm and blues belters Bettye Lavette and Lee Fields prove that classic soul resonates with a new generation of listeners. The fantastic "Locked Down" (produced by Black Keys Dan Auerbach) reinvigorates Dr. John and claims a Grammy in this year's Blues category.

The early night (7:30pm) series at Performance Works offers a potent start to festival evenings. Pianist Vijay lyer has emerged as one of the most daring jazz artists of his generation, capturing the attention of the jazz press with an unprecedented winning of five categories in the 2012 Downbeat Critics poll. Also featured in the Series are the Afro-Caribbean sounds of the UK's Courtney Pine; singers Gregory Porter and Youn Nun Nah are taking the jazz world by storm: Patricia Barber presenting some of her finest work to date; ace guitarist Kurt Rosenwinkel returns for his first festival appearance in many years and a Quincy Jones discovery, Cuban pianist Alfredo Rodriguez will surprise us all!

The 22 concert Innovation Series at the Ironworks and the Roundhouse provide an overview of what's current on the creative edges of the global jazz scene featuring artists from Canada to Brooklyn

and beyond. Mind-blowing saxophonist Colin Stetson (Bon Iver. Arcade Fire, Mats Gustafsson) has a solo set at the Venue (celebrating New History Warfare Vol. 3) and collaborates with local hero Gordon Grdina's Trio (Dan Mangan, Haram, The Crackling). The centerpiece of this year's "Spotlight on French Jazz" is the French American Peace Ensemble and Didier Petit's East-West Ensemble. "Made in the UK" also returns with the "do not miss" Phronesis, considered to be among today's most imaginative and exciting piano trios. Bands led by drummers Alan Jones (a knockout Canadian Sextet) and Tomas Fujiwara (representing the cream of the new Brooklyn scene), along with Tim Berne's Snake Oil (ECM) are a must for adventurous jazz fans. We're shining a small spotlight on Chicago with the Jason Adasiewicz Sun Rooms and Norwegian pianist Christian Wallumrod plays the festival for the first time.

Our bookend free weekends Downtown Jazz (an incredible success in its inaugural year) and David Lam Park Jazz offer a plethora of music, arts, bistros, kids' activities and much more, and along with our free programs at Granville Island, including Canada Day, are not to be missed. We'd also like to recognize notable partnerships and collaborations with New Forms, Hard Rubber Orchestra, Western Front and Music BC

In the past year we've lost many friends in the international jazz community, but none hit closer to home than the loss of Vancouver's Ross Taggart, to whom we dedicate this year's festival.





"This trio can swing hard, yet the music remains a warming wash of tones and resonances" — All About Jazz

First-call Chicago musicians Jason Adasiewicz Sun Rooms shares some of the directness of Chicago jazz, but fans of the Windy City's post-rock scene (Tortoise) will also be drawn to the textural sounds from a very physical *vibraphone* player using blurred overtones to create ambient harmonies over the cool, driving rhythm section of *bassist* Devin Hoff and Mike Reed *drums* (Nicole Mitchell, Jeff Parker). They're joined for the encore second set by one of Canada's top shelf improvisers, Vancouver *clarinetist* François Houle, himself a master of melding overtones to create next-level harmonic textures.
