




Intense and Exciting Times

These are intense and exciting times for the Coastal Jazz and Blues Society. As we approach the fourth annual du Maurier Ltd. International Jazz Festival production, it's instructive to view the activities of the past year.

Our non-festival presentations have increased by 100 per cent, to 35 evenings of music including the series **Time Flies**, which found international artists collaborating with our own N.O.W. musicians.

WESTCAN JAZZ (an association of festivals and societies in Vancouver, Victoria, Edmonton, Calgary, and Saskatoon) has continued to develop, co-operating in the presentation of major international jazz artists, and providing a performance vehicle for emerging Canadian artists.

The impact of world music on jazz continues to be a major development. The multicultural elements of our festival, with major artists from Africa, Japan, Europe, and North and South America, have assumed an increasing importance. This fourth program is certainly our strongest and most eclectic. As rock, classical and world music cultures wreak havoc on the once-orderly boundaries of jazz, the demarcation of these traditions becomes blurred.

Creative music is establishing itself as a prominent force in Canadian culture. The du Maurier Ltd. International Jazz Festival, Vancouver, is a vital survey of much that's significant in the world of jazz in 1989.
