
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### A MESSAGE FROM OUR SPONSOR:

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Welcome to the du Maurier International JAZZ FESTIVAL in Vancouver! This project was brought to fruition over a two year period by a very dedicated group of hardworking professional jazz fans.

In August, '85 we presented a week long extravaganza of jazz and blues, featuring primarily local and regional musicians. For the first time, Vancouver audiences were exposed to the wonderful music of Bert Wilson, Aladar Pege, Obrador, Isaac Scott, Al Hood... This was the First Annual PACIFIC JAZZ AND BLUES FESTIVAL. Funding for this event was close to NON-existent, but nonetheless it was an unqualified success on it's own terms.

This year the du Maurier Council for the Arts has provided a grant which has enabled us to produce a major world class international jazz festival. The COASTAL JAZZ AND BLUES SOCIETY's primary objective is to produce an annual JAZZ FESTIVAL, thus bringing an unprecedented array of talent to the PACIFIC NORTH WEST.

Throughout the year, the COASTAL JAZZ AND BLUES SOCIETY has committed it's resources to producing concerts and club dates; introducing audiences to Michel Petrucciani, Joanne Brackeen, James Moody, World Saxophone Quartet, Johnny Copeland, Brotzmann-Bennink...

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

IOHNNY ADAMS WITH EARL KING - he is the master of "the slow burn", with a big, versatile tenor voice that simply oozes soul. Johnny Adams, "The Tan Canary" clearly owns any stage he works. Combining his gospel roots and a rhythm and blues influence into an impressive thirty-year career with over seventy records to his credit.

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HENRY KAISER – a very original contemporary electric guitarist whose style combines various ethnic influences, delta blues, Captain Beefheart, modern electronics and free improvisation – A cofounder of Metalanguage Records, he has recently recorded with Herbie Hancock, Fred Frith and Bill Laswell.

His album, "Exhiliration" with Pepper Adams, has received rave reviews in the jazz press.
