#### CHIEF FEATURE

Chief Feature, comprised of Western Canada's most versatile musicians, was formed in 1981 with the idea of blending outside and inside music. Theirs is serious and uncompromising jazz, drawn from several musical streams born in the '60s. For all their influences, there is no imitation in the group's original and acoustically contemporary sound. Reed has played with the Paul Plimley Octet and works with Lunar Adventures (featured at New Jazz/ New City II); both Freedman and Reed are part of the Vancouver Art Trio which played the 1985 Nimes Jazz Festival in France; Bill Clark performed and recorded with VEJI, the Vancouver Ensemble of Jazz Improvisation, first place winners of the 1981 Canadian Stage Band Festival. Chief Feature's recording, "When Elephants Dance," is available on tape.
