Leader Brad Muirhead has assembled an eight piece modern marching band whose musical horizons include the original and avant garde while never

losing sight of its origins.

Friday, March 11 **CLAUDE RANGER Trio**: One of the premier jazz talents in Canada, Ranger has collaborated with Sonny Rollins, Lenny Breau, Dave Liebman, Phil Woods and James Moody. His Vancouver trio features Scott White (bass) and Rob Frayne (tenor). Thursday, March 17 **COAST QUARTET**: Formed in 1981, this quartet explores the freer harmonic and rhythmic structures of contemporary jazz. Bill Clark (trumpet) and Pat Caird (reeds) are original members of the acclaimed VEJI ensemble. Bassist Rick Kilburn (formerly with Dave Brubeck) is one of Vancouver's first-call musicians. Dennis Burke (percussion) provides a sensitive foundation for the band's free, conversational approach.

Friday, March 18 (Special Event) JAY CLAYTON, JULIAN PRIESTER AND JERRY GRANELLI. Sat., March 19 WORKSHOP with Clayton, Priester, Granelli. 2 p.m. Saturday, March 19 BRUCE FREEDMAN and CHIEF FEATURE: Chief Feature is a marriage of traditional and avant garde elements, slightly off-center tunes which you can't stop humming. Thursday, March 31 **THEMBA TANA'S AFRICAN HERITAGE**: Group leader Themba Tana draws on his musical experiences from Zimbabwe, Botswana and Mozambique, and with Govind Dido, Albert St. Albert and Sal Ferreras creates an unforgettable musical experience. African Heritage has performed at the Commonwealth Drum Festival and Drum

Heat.
