

BRASS ROOTS: A dynamic new ensemble inspired by the tradition of New Orleans carnival bands. Leader Brad Muirhead has assembled an eight piece modern marching band whose musical horizons include the original and avant garde while never losing sight of its origins.

CLAUDE RANGER Trio: One of the premier jazz talents in Canada, Ranger has collaborated with Sonny Rollins, Lenny Breau, Dave Liebman, Phil Woods and James Moody. His Vancouver trio features Scott White (bass) and Rob Frayne (tenor). KATE HAMMETT-VAUGHAN and

COAST QUARTET: Formed in 1981, this quartet explores the freer harmonic and rhythmic structures of contemporary jazz. Bill Clark (trumpet) and Pat Caird (reeds) are original members of the acclaimed VEJI ensemble. Bassist Rick Kilburn (formerly with Dave Brubeck) is one of Vancouver's first-call musicians. MICHAEL BLAKE Quartet: A Vancouver tenor saxophonist, Michael Blake has returned from New York City where he has been studying with Dave Liebman. This concert will feature Michael's compositions, reflecting his N.Y. experience. With Ross Taggart (piano), Ken Lister (bass) and Blaine Wikjord (drums).

Friday, March 25

LUNAR ADVENTURES: From jazz and harmolodic funk to Celtic and Calypso, Lunar has been featured at the duMaurier International Jazz Festivals (Vancouver), on CBC Radio Canada and in the Seattle New Jazz New City concert series. LUNAR ADVENTURES is Coat Cooke (tenor/alto), Ron Samworth (guitar/soundscapes), Clyde Reed (bass) and Gregg Simpson (batterie).

UNIT - E (formerly the Graham Ord Trio): The recipient of Alex Varty's Coltrane

Giant Steps Award for 1987 (a shared honor with Phil Dwyer), Graham Ord has assembled a spirited and sensitive quartet. Percussionist Roger Baird, who worked in New York with William Parker (now with Cecil Taylor) and Billy Bang, has settled in Vancouver and has enriched the contemporary scene. New member Daniel Lapp is featured on both trumpet and violin. Paul Blaney (bass) brings it all together with a spontaneous and always swinging feel.

Thursday, March 31 THEMBA TANA'S AFRICAN

HERITAGE: Group leader Themba Tana draws on his musical experiences from Zimbabwe, Botswana and Mozambique, and with Govind Dido, Albert St. Albert and Sal Ferreras creates an unforgettable musical experience. African Heritage has performed at the Commonwealth Drum Festival, Drum Heat, and the Calgary Olympic Arts Festival.

PAUL PLIMLEY Trio: "unparalleled rhythmic acuity, keyboard articulation of crystalline brilliance and enough melodic wit and verve to trigger several spontaneaous gasps and bursts of amazed hilarity. CREATURES OF HABIT: A five man music unit performing original modern electric jazz fusion; and modern acoustic jazz echoing the styles of Steps Ahead and other contemporary groups. (guitar).





New Orchestra Workshop provides a focus for the creation of an original west coast Canadian musical idiom.

Origins

New Orchestra Workshop was formed in 1977 by a group of Vancouver musicians to fulfill a need in the local creative music community for workshop, rehearsal and performance space. Early achievements include: Canada Council Explorations Grant in 1978; Sponsorship of Workshops by Dr. Karl Berger of the Creative Music Studio, Woodstock, New York; organization of Three Creative Music Festivals in 1979, 1980 and 1981.

Projects and Activities

Oct.-Dec. 1986 Creative Music Series #1 at the Centre Culturel Francophone De Vancouver.

Jan. 26, 1987 New Orchestra Workshop Registered as Non-Profit Society.

Feb.-April, 1987 Creative Music Series #2 at the Centre Culturel Francophone De Vancouver.

June, 1987 Co-produced a series of music workshops with Vancouver Community College and Coastal Jazz and Blues Society, in conjunction with the 1987 duMaurier Jazz Festival. July, 1987 New Orchestra Workshop ensemble <u>Hugh Fraser Quintet</u> wins the Alcan Jazz Competition, NOW ensembles perform at major Canadian Jazz Festivals.

Sept., 1987 A multi-media production entitled "Sequences" was presented at the Vancouver Fringe Festival.
Oct.-Nov., 1987 Creative Music Series #3 at the Centre


