November 12, 86 8:00 P.M. (\$4.00 and \$5.00):

The Fraser-Ryga Quartet (From VEJI):
The trombonist and pianist Hugh Fraser, father of
the well known VEJI Orchestra, and Campbell Ryga, master
lyricist of the alto saxophone, pool their efforts together
in this new and original quartet. It is a debut performance
consisting of their new compositions. Two other musicians
(from VEJI too) will also play: Chris Nelson, string bass,

and Buff Allen, drums.

The Vancouver Art Trio:

Bruce Freedman, tenor saxophone. Clyde Reed, bass. Gregg Simpson, drums. The group features an approach to spontaneous improvisation which utilizes forms and thematic material fusing influences from be-bop, afro-american music, and post-Coltrane free jazz. Not easy listening music, its intensity is compelling.

The Jazzoids, featuring Bill Clark, is an alumni of VEJI and The Powder Blues Band. Their program includes new compositions of high energy fusion jazz by Clark and Fraser. The musicians are: Bill Clark (trumpet), Hugh Fraser (keyboard and trombone), Phil Dwyer (keyboard and saxophone), Dennis Bucke (drums) and Mick Lent (bass). Be prepared for unexpected surprises!

Lunar Adventures is a quartet of Vancouver musicians formed to play their own original compositions in clubs and concert settings. Their music is a synthesis of jazz, funk, Latin American and other forms of indegenous music. The members of the group are: Coat Cook (tenor saxophone), Ron Samworth (electric guitar), Clyde Reed (bass) and Greggg Simpson (drums).
