

EMAGOSTO LISBON 3—8 2004

In geographical terms, this year's JAZZ EM AGOSTO has broadened its musical horizons, bringing in the elite from the flourishing Vancouver scene (Canada), whilst also including interludes from the no less fertile European scene in Vienna (Austria), Oslo and Stockholm (Norway and Sweden), Berlin (Germany), the Iberian Peninsula (Lisbon and Valencia) and Tokyo (Japan).

Twelve concerts presenting twelve varying outlooks, diving essentially into two main sets, acoustic and electronic, which encapsulate the theory and practice of jazz today. Twelve musical projects previously unheard in Portugal which will help to create an understanding of the aesthetic expansion of jazz in the twenty first century, whether or not we accept the inevitable trend towards globalisation and the transformation of jazz through emerging technologies. JAZZ EM AGOSTO will play host to the different faces of jazz, in unstoppable evolution in step with the contemporary world, appealing to the free and eager sensibility of our audience, used in previous years to something less humdrum than the normal fare at international jazz events, where the main concern is to project the leading names, validated by resounding record sales.

TUESDAY

This year's festival also marks a return to open-air concerts, one of the event's trademark features, once again presenting a range of different sized ensembles, from solo performances to bid bands, and again presenting a Portuguese artist twinned with a fellow Iberian.

A selective look at the contemporary jazz scene, unfazed by new horizons and aimed at enquiring minds, free of preconceptions, but aware of what a message, perhaps even the most transcendental, might mean.



ANFITEATRO AO AR LIVRE - 21:30

NOW ORCHESTRA DIRECTED BY GEORGE LEWIS

Founded in 1987, this orchestra from Vancouver, Canada, has continuously transformed itself over its 25 years of existence, reaching one of its high points in *The Shadowgraph Series*, dedicated to the compositions of the virtuoso trombone player and composer George Lewis, a Chicago legend who started out at the Association for the Advancement of Creative Music (AACM).
