



Think about this: the TD Canada Trust Vancouver International Jazz Festival, Winterruption Festival on Granville Island, and the greatest number of free events in town; community initiatives such as jazz festival workshops, JazzStreet Vancouver, and the Creative Music Think Tank; education programs such as the TD Canada Trust High School Jazz Intensive. The driving force behind them all is Coastal Jazz, the foundation of music in the city and the organization of sound.

Towards the end of 2010, the new facility located at the CBC Plaza on Hamilton Street will provide:

8500 square feet of community-use space in downtown Vancouver; a secure, below-market rate for 30 years; priority use of CBC's new indoor 120-seat theatre and outdoor stage located just steps from our new home; an enhanced box office with state-of-the-art listening stations; a music education centre with resources and programs for youth; services for Vancouver festivals; and a gathering place for the community.



When performing with the Fred Stride Orchestra during the summer of 2008, singer Dee Daniels spoke to the audience and put it "out in the universe" that she was looking for help to bring the Sacred Music of Duke Ellington to Vancouver—she didn't know who, how, or what would happen. The next day she received an email.

Tony Weall, on the staff of the First United Church Mission, was in that audience the night before and the music touched him. The initiatives that have since developed from this one pair of ears has resulted in the mounting of this meaningful performance—a way to recognize, support, and continue the work of the First United Church Mission as they approach their 125th year of serving in Vancouver's Downtown Eastside community.

Today in the Vancouver Downtown Eastside, it is not the mills or wealth creation that draws the attention; instead of the decimated trees, it is the decimated lives at the margins of the city. The statistics tell the story:

- 10 city blocks with a population of 10,000
- 75% of residents are classified as "low-income"
- 5,000 to 6,000 are addicted and/or mentally ill

- 750 to 1,000 people are classified as homeless
- 50% of those are chronically homeless

PEGGY LEE'S FILM IN MUSIC

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 17 AT 8 PM THE IRONWORKS

Vancouver cellist Peggy Lee was inspired to create Film in Music after hearing improvised solos by Evan Parker, Peter Evans, and Mary Oliver at the 2008 Time Flies Festival. Lee says, "I was struck by how, on one level, such exploration can be so subtle and personal and yet, on another level, be filled with such a sense of drama and suspense."

Lee envisions a context in which such exploration could work within a set of written music, pieces which would heighten the dramatic experience of the solos. She wants to convey the cinematic effects of that drama using musical choices, not as an attempt to tell any story in particular but to evoke a similar tension between players, creating suspense and

absolutely focused, driven performances. With Torsten Müller bass, Jesse Zubot violin, Kevin Elaschuk trumpet, Ron Samworth guitar, Chris Gestrin piano, André Lachance bass, Dylan van der Schyff drums.

Anthony Braxton, composer, saxophonist, clarinetist, flautist, pianist, and philosopher, is widely and critically acclaimed as a seminal figure in the music of the late 20th century. He has created a vast body of highly complex work ranging from solo saxophone performances to elaborate compositions for huge ensembles such as his For Four Orchestras. One of the most prolific American musician/composers in history. Braxton has released over 100 recordings since he joined the Chicago-based AACM (Association for the Advancement of Creative Musicians) back in 1966. Over the next four decades he broke new conceptual and technical ground, extending and expanding upon jazz and Euro/ American classical music traditions as defined by master improvisers such as John Coltrane. Paul Desmond, Warne Marsh, and Ornette Coleman, and by composers such as Charles Ives, Harry Partch, John Cage, Stockhausen. and Varese. His work has attracted wide-

ranging collaborators such as Chick Corea, Dave Holland, Max Roach, Evan Parker, Derek Bailey, Pat Metheny, Richard Teitelbaum, Wolf Eves, Robert Schumann String Quartet, and countless others. His long list of awards and achievements includes the 1994 MacArthur "Genius" Award. With his 12-piece ensemble, the 12 + 1 tet, Braxton's music moves freely between the performance of compositions and improvisations and between solos and ensemble playing—and yet weaves magical and mysteriously integrated textures full of sparks. Come and experience the enormously stimulating, sophisticated, and passionate music of one of the world's most dynamic musical forces. With **Anthony Braxton** reeds/composition, **Taylor** Ho Bynum cornet/trumpet/flugelhorn/bass trumpet, Nicole Mitchell flutes. Andrew Raffo Dewar, James Fei reeds, Steve Lehman saxophones, Sara Schoenbeck bassoon, Jessica Pavone violin/ alto viola, Mary Halvorson electric guitar, Reut Regev trombone, Jay Rozen tuba, Carl Testa double bass/bass clarinet, Aaron Siegel drums/ percussion/vibes.

The Sonic Genome is one of the most thrillingly ambitious experiments by musical *visionary/* saxophonist/composer Anthony Braxton: less a concert than the creation of an interactive musical environment. For eight continuous hours, 50+ performers use the compositions and improvisational languages developed by Braxton through his 40 years of artistic investigation to create a living sound world. Ensembles form and split apart like cells dividing and reforming into new organisms; likewise, the members of the audience are invited to be active participants, choosing who and what to listen to as they move about the space.

Braxton enlists the band members of the 12 + 1tet as his musical lieutenants in the endeavour. with each given the responsibility of leading sub ensembles of the larger group. The rest of the performers are drawn from the surrounding community, ranging from local professionals to college and high school students.

In addition to being a massive statement by a master artist, the Sonic Genome also serves as a powerful tool for creating bonds in the local community. No listener or performer emerges unmoved by the experience; participants describe the event as "life-changing," resulting in new friendships, and lasting artistic inspiration. And while Braxton conducted a Sonic Genome as a recording project in 2003 (to be released as an interactive DVD in the next year), the Vancouver performance will be the world premiere of the project as a public performance.

TORSTEN MÜLLER



Renowned German bassist Torsten Müller continues to be a valued collaborator on Vancouver's creative music scene since making the city his home almost a decade ago. A great improviser who expands the sonic possibilities of his instrument through extended techniques, Müller has worked with a diverse cast of international improvisers including Gunter Christmann, Ken Vandermark, Evan Parker, John Butcher, and Robin Holcomb.

MEI HAN



Mei Han is a groundbreaking virtuoso on the Chinese *zheng.* Presenting music deeply rooted in over two thousand years of Chinese culture, she is transforming the stately zheng into a powerful tool for the contemporary international concert stage. Han regularly performs challenging new works by leading-edge composers including compositions by Minoru Miki, Yuji Takahashi, and Barry Truax. As an accomplished improviser, she has toured internationally with the Mei Han Art Ensemble. Her collaborators include piano luminary Paul Plimley and mandolin master John Reischman.

DYLAN VAN DER SCHYFF



Vancouver drummer **Dylan van der Schyff** is a heavyweight in the city's acclaimed jazz and improvised music community. *AllAboutJazz.com* notes that his "ability to extract an infinite variety of textures from a simple drum kit is unparalleled." Besides working with local groups like Talking Pictures, NOW Orchestra, and the Brad Turner Quartet, Dylan collaborates with international names like Dave Douglas, Mark Helias, Achim Kauffman, and Fredrik Ljungkvist.

SARA SCHOENBECK



Californian **Sara Schoenbeck** is a *bassoonist* who dedicates herself to expanding the sound and role of her instrument in the worlds of contemporary notated and improvised music. *The Wire* magazine (London) places her in the "tiny club of bassoon pioneers" at work in contemporary music today, and the *New York Times* calls her "riveting," noting that she mixes "textural experiments with a big, confident sound." She is a member of Anthony Braxton's 12+1 tet, Wayne Horvitz's Gravitas Quartet, and Vinny Golia's Large Ensemble.

Curated by **Ken Pickering** and **Torsten Müller**, this three-night collaborative project has eight internationally acclaimed musicians (three from Vancouver and five from the USA) exploring improvisational practices in a warm, intimate setting. Each evening the octet pushes the music into daring and invigorating terrain using different combinations of players throughout.

Brooklyn-based *string instrumentalist/composer* **Jessica Pavone** is best known for her work with Anthony Braxton's 12 + 1 tet and for her duo project with guitarist Mary Halvorson, which has been described as "distinct and beguiling [whose] core is steely, and its execution clear" (*New York Times*). She currently plays bass guitar and viola in her 60's soul-inspired band The Pavones, and she plays viola and composes for No Way to Say Goodbye (a string quartet that substitutes a second violin for a double bass).



New Yorker **Taylor Ho Bynum** is a *brass instrumentalist/composer* committed to the further exploration of composition and improvisation pioneered by masters like Ellington, Ives, and the AACM, but with a third-millennial flavour and a trickster sensibility. He presently leads his Trio, his Sextet, the chamber ensemble SpiderMonkey Strings, and the little big band Positive Catastrophe, and he has developed a body of solo music for cornet and duo work with dancer/choreographer Rachel Bernsen. Bynum regularly performs with Anthony Braxton, Cecil Taylor, and Bill Dixon.
