

Not since the Jan Garbarek Ouartet of the '70s has a Scandinavian band generated as much excitement and acclaim. The Guardian calls Atomic "one of the most exhilarating groups on the European circuit." A key exponent of the "new wave" of Nordic jazz currently attracting lots of press attention, Atomic was formed in 1999 by five important young musicians from the burgeoning jazz scenes of Sweden and Norway. Combining the powerful, cutting-edge Oslo rhythm section of Håvard Wiik on piano, Ingebrigt Håker-Flaten on bass, and Paal Nilssen-Love on drums with the Stockholm front line of trumpeter Magnus Broo and saxophonist Fredrik Ljungkvist, the quintet is one of the hottest acoustic ensembles to have emerged at the turn of the century. Atomic plays original music that mixes grooves and modes with a distinctive approach to free playing. Think classic Miles Davis meets late-period Coltrane meets Art Blakey & the Jazz

Messengers, and you'll get an idea

why their terrific sounds have spurred

collaborations with leading contemporary jazz musicians, including Chris Potter and Ken Vandermark from the U.S., Iain Ballamy from the U.K., and the Swede Per 'Texas' Johansson. A Vancouver International Jazz Festival favourite, the band has released four outstanding CDs, Feet Music, Boom Boom, The Bikini Tapes, Happy New Ears (Norwegian Grammy for Best Album, 2006), on Bugge Wesseltoft's Jazzland label.



A brilliant and uncompromising innovator, saxophonist/composer Ornette groups, his basic musical concept has Coleman is recognized as one of the most remained consistent. He is interested in remarkable musicians in jazz history. Few creative artists of our time have displayed greater originality or influence. Entertainment Weekly's Larry Blumenfeld calls him "a fountain of sublime ideas." Steve Futterman of the *New Yorker* writes, "Fifty years after he astonished the musical world with his initial forays into free jazz, Ornette Coleman remains astounding."

Coleman belongs to that rare breed of artist/thinker whose influence extends far beyond the realm of his chosen idiom. Always putting virtuosity at the service of melody and emotion, he has had a powerful impact on how musicians play, improvise, and compose, and how music aficionados listen. Many of his compositions (Lonely Woman, Peace, Turnaround, The Blessing, and When Will the Blues Leave?) have become jazz standards. While Ornette has led a wide variety of formations from duos to

symphony orchestras, electric to acoustic performing music that allows all voices equal weight; all musicians are free to make deeply individual contributions while listening closely to one another. He calls this system 'harmolodics,' which he now refers to as 'sound grammar.' For his vision and innovation, 77-yearold Ornette Coleman has been rewarded with numerous accolades including the MacArthur "Genius" Award, the 2007 Pulitzer Prize in Music (for his live album *Sound Grammar*), and a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award. His current band features Tony Falanga and Charnett Moffett acoustic basses, Al McDowell electric bass, and son Denardo Coleman drums.



DAVE BRUBECK QUARTET

Pianist Dave Brubeck is a living legend. For over 60 years this jazz giant has thrilled legions of devoted fans while improvising in unique rhythms and time signatures. Beginning as a composition student with the famous French composer Darius Milhaud, he led strongly European-influenced jazz groups in the late '40s before his quartet featuring Paul Desmond established him as an artist of international stature. After Desmond left in 1967, Gerry Mulligan became a member of the group and Dave's sons joined later. In the '80s reed-man Jerry Bergonzi and clarinetist Bill Smith toured with Brubeck. A prolific writer, and forever associated with his hit record of Desmond's composition Take Five, Dave himself has written tunes like Blue Rondo à la Turk and In Your Own Sweet Way that have become classics in the jazz canon. While always expanding jazz horizons, Brubeck has performed and recorded with Leonard Bernstein and the New York Philharmonic as well as with legendary figures Louis Armstrong,



Jimmy Rushing, and Carmen McRae. He has also worked with current greats like Joshua Redman, Roy Hargrove, and Christian McBride. Over a distinguished career, Brubeck has received many honours including a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award in 1996 and a Jazz Master's Award presented to him in 1999 by the National Endowment for the Arts. Dave's joy in performing and his daring improvisations continue to challenge and excite audiences around the world. This concert is destined to be one of the highlights of the 2008 TD Canada Trust Vancouver International Jazz Festival. Renowned German bassist Torsten Müller has become a valued collaborator in our vibrant creative music scene since making Vancouver his home some seven years ago. A fearless improviser who continually expands the sonic possibilities of his instrument through extended techniques, Müller has worked with a wide range of international improvisers including: Gunter Christmann, Paul Rutherford, Lol Coxhill and Ken

Vandermark.

British saxophonist Evan **Parker** is one of the most original voices in contemporary music. A longtime leading figure in the European scene, Parker is recognized for his brilliant work in small group collaborations with Barry Guy and Paul Lytton, as well as with groups like Globe Unity, the Barry Guy New Orchestra, the London Jazz Composers Orchestra and his own Electro-Acoustic Ensemble. His unique style of improvisation reveals a total command of free music techniques, circular breathing, slaps, snorts, and over-blowing used to create extended, complex, overlapping,

repetitive, and beautiful soundscapes.

Montreal guitarist/ composer Bernard Falaise currently performs with Miriodor, Klaxon Gueule, The Unexpected, Les Projectionnistes, Diesel, and other groups. He has written works for the Ensemble Contemporain de Montreal, Quartango, and the Isis Ouartet, and has created music for exhibitions, television, theatre, and dance. Defying categorization, Falaise explores acid rock, twelve-tone waltzes, and industrial tangos with equal enthusiasm. A partial list of his collaborators includes Ron Samworth, Pierre Tanguay, Martin Tétrault, Lori Freedman, and Jean Derome.

Together with Maja Ratkje in the group Fe-Mail, Norwegian Hild Sofie Tafjord performs compelling and seductive noise music. She uses *electronics* and French horn to build immense walls of sound freely improvised music with a cacophonic feeling of liberation. Tafjord, who is also a member of SPUNK, Agrare, and Slinger, has composed

music for dance performances, film, and theatre installations. She has also worked with Ikue Mori, Fred Frith, and Wolf Eyes.

New York-based trumpeter **Peter Evans** works in a variety of settings including solo performance, chamber orchestras, free improvised contexts, and electro-acoustic music and composition. His solo trumpet album More is More was released on Evan Parker's psi label in 2006, and his debut album as a leader called The Peter Evans Quartet (Firehouse 12) was released in 2007. Besides his own quartet he works with Moppa Elliot's band Mostly Other People Do the Killing and Carnival Skin (with Perry Robinson, Klaus Kugel, Bruce Eisenbeil etc).

California native and violinist Mary Oliver is a much-heralded member of the acclaimed Dutch improvising ensemble the ICP Orchestra. Her work as a soloist encompasses both composed and improvised contemporary music. She has premiered works by John Cage and Morton Feldman and has

worked alongside improvising musicians such as George Lewis, Joëlle Léandre, and Phil Minton.

Vancouver drummer **Dylan van** der Schyff excels whatever the context: mainstream jazz or free improvised settings. He leads his own group, Bande X, and also works in resident bands like Talking Pictures, NOW Orchestra, and the Peggy Lee Band. He also collaborates with international artists Dave Douglas, Mark Helias, Louis Sclavis, and Achim Kaufmann.

Vancouver clarinetist François **Houle** is one of Canada's finest musicians. He explores many facets of modern music-from electronic manipulation to acoustic contemporary chamber music. He has performed with Marilyn Crispell, Dave Douglas, Evan Parker, Tom Varner, Benoit Delbecq, and the NOW Orchestra. Houle has released more than a dozen critically acclaimed albums, including a recent CD of solo improvisations called Aerials (Drip Audio).








TORD GUSTAVSEN TRIO



WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 13 AT 8 PM

CHRIST CHURCH CATHEDRAL

"Gustavsen is a lyric poet of the piano."—Jazz Times Led by *pianist* **Tord Gustavsen**, this lyrical yet robust Norwegian trio featuring Harald Johnsen bass and **Jarle Vespestad** drums stands out as a cutting-edge romantic ensemble, playing melodic jazz without sacrificing the freedom of improvisation. Traces of inspiration from Caribbean music, early blues, hymns, Scandinavian folk music, and impressionism are synthesized in a highly original musical sensibility. "The music shimmers," says New York's Village Voice. "Soulfully hip. Haunting, hook-based themes delivered as a close three-way embrace," writes the Guardian, while the BBC Online notes the "hushed, delicate romanticism that's hard to resist." The trio has released three acclaimed recordings on ECM Records (Changing Places, The Ground, Being

There). Not surprisingly, these guys are

among the most in-demand players on the burgeoning Norwegian music scene and are known from projects like Supersilent, Farmers Market, Bugge Wesseltoft Group, Silje Nergaard Band, and Nymark Collective. Gustavsen's clearly delineated melodies define a large part of the trio's sonic identity, but so does the manner in which the band approaches them. Technical flamboyance gives way to a majestically restrained lyricism where every note resonates with subtle detail and nuance. The resulting music is spellbinding. British magazine Jazzwise is accurate in its assessment that "there is really not a piano trio in the whole of jazz that sounds like Gustavsen."

Since its inception in 2000, the Spanish Harlem Orchestra has established itself as the standard bearer of contemporary Latin music. Directed by world-renowned pianist, arranger, and producer Oscar Hernandez, the 13-member all-star ensemble features ace musicians who have worked with legendary names of the classic New York salsa scene—Tito Puente, Celia Cruz, Ruben Blades, Ray Barretto, Willie Colon, and many more. An exciting, explosive group, SHO is at the forefront of disseminating the energy, creativity, and spirit of true New York

Legendary singer/songwriter Paul Simon calls the Spanish Harlem Orchestra "one of the best musical groups in the business." "Pure neo-retro salsa dura that couldn't possibly be improved upon," states the All Music Guide. The Los Angeles Times writes, "Watching these crack musicians rev up their complex, precision polyrhythms and fire up five-part horn harmonies is as thrilling as riding a horse

that suddenly breaks into a gallop." United We Swing (Six Degrees),

Spanish Harlem Orchestra's third album, is a stunning follow-up to their 2004 Grammy Award-winning album Across 110th St. and their 2002 Grammynominated debut, Un Gran Dia En El Barrio. Many of the songs are original compositions grounded in the musical legacy of El Barrio, a pulsating Eastside community in NYC located to the south of 125th St., that gave rise to Boogaloo, Latin Soul, and Salsa. Whether original material or famous covers, the music of Spanish Harlem Orchestra is an irresistible magnet for the dance floor.

Opening the show are Vancouver's own salsa kings, Rumba Calzada. Led by bandleader Raphael Geronimo, Rumba Calzada blends salsa, jazz, and Afro-Cuban rhythms to create a toe-tapping and soul-moving Caribbean musical fusion. A favourite with Vancouver audiences for over a decade, this Juno-nominated band plays powerful and joyful music. New York and Vancouver unite at the Commodore for a Salsa Spectacular.

"She has her eyes set on a hybrid music that mingles everything from Irish folk to bhangra....Ahluwalia gracefully wrests her way around notes like a cobra wrapping itself around an unsuspecting neck."—Time Out Chicago A highly distinctive vocalist, Indian-born, Ahluwalia's latest recording, Toronto-raised Kiran Ahluwalia creates a vibrant twenty-first century sound from an ancient rule-bound song form. The Juno Award winner is considered one of North America's great interpreters of ghazal—the Indian and Pakistani sung poetry about unrequited love. Kiran has developed a repertoire of intriguing songs by seeking out Urdu poets in the Indian diaspora and setting their lyrics to music. The result is a

collection of spellbinding, boundary-pushing ghazals and fun-loving Punjabi folk songs, which she delivers in her seductive Bollywood voice using contemporary instruments and arrangements. Casting her unique ghazal style as its underpinning, Wanderlust (Times Square/40) Records), also draws on the melancholic Portuguese song form fado, African grooves, jazz, and more. MOTHER MOTHER PLUS SAID THE WHALE

In a world of indie groups that all sound alike. Vancouver's Mother Mother is a true breath of fresh air with a sound all their own. Recently signed to indie powerhouse Last Gang Records, they are poised to become the next big thing. Performing the unique and often brilliant songs of Ryan Guldemond acoustic & electric guitar/vocals, their artfully directed sound is a mix of vaudevillian country, postpunk interludes, and harmonies that lie somewhere between Ian and Sylvia and the Pixies. Formed in January 2005, Mother Mother's wry lyricism touches on contemporary lile III and beauty and balderdash, and on contemporary life in all its

Opening the show is Said the Whale. Vancouver *singer/songwriter* Kevin House boasts an impressive voice and keen melodic sense. His folksy CDs (Gutter Pastoral, House of Beauty) have drawn critical praise worldwide and comparisons to Nick Drake and Leonard Cohen. Roots Highway (Italy) refers to Kevin's "beautiful, disarming sadness." Americana-UK.com writes, "the spirit of early Tom Waits infuses this music with his metropolitan late night boho regret," while the Montreal Gazette alludes to "a priestly melancholy... all soft rain, windswept streets and one man wondering." Vancouver's **Inhabitants** serve up sounds ranging from electric jazz-fusion inspired by Miles Davis to the instrumental postrock of Tortoise to contemporary ambient grooves. Rich sonic textures, subtle melodic ideas, and a strong rhythmic sensibility are the signatures of this cool band. Inhabitants are J.P. Carter trumpet, electronics, Dave Sikula guitar, Pete Schmitt electric bass, and Skve Brooks drums.







LISA MILLER OCTET FRIDAY, MARCH 14 AT 8 PM **WESTERN FRONT**





THE IRONWORKS

Michael Herring is a young Toronto bassist/composer/arranger and one of the most exciting musicians on the Canadian scene. His original jazz sextet, Vertigo, featuring New York alto saxophonist Dave Binney (Gil Evans, Bobby Previte) draws on the influence of New York's Downtown Jazz scene as it mixes composed and improvised elements driven by rhythmically sophisticated grooves. Herring's work is reminiscent of Dave Holland, Drew Gress, and Chris Potter yet at times recalls the classic sixties' sextet sound of Wayne Shorter guitar, Nick Fraser drums. and Booker Little in colour, texture, and

energy. Vertigo's debut album, Coniferous Revenge, grooves hard with influences of reggae, modern classical music, and folk adding to the core jazz sound. In a recent review, the Victoria Times Colonist called it a "modern mix of jazz tradition and adventurous experimentation." "One of the most exciting and interesting albums to arrive this year...[the] overall impact is tremendous," writes the Toronto Star. With **Ouinsin Nachoff** sax/clarinet. 

John Surman, and Normand Guilbeault.


HARD RUBBER ORCHESTRA
