



Rez Abbasi's Bazaar Performance Works

This all-star band will delight fans of Shakti, Trilok Gurtu, and other world-jazz fusion masters. New York-based guitarist Rez Abbasi, whose organic mix of jazz with elements of Indian classical music creates a singular and distinctive sound, leads the group. With Juno Award winning vocalist Kiran Ahluwalia, Hammond B-3 organ player Sam Barsh, and drummer Dan Weiss in tow, this stimulating cultural crossover is rhythmically captivating and utterly mesmerizing.

The music and genius of Django Reinhardt inspired transplanted Winnipegger Ross Bliss to take up the *guitar*. Not surprisingly, it's solid swinging gypsy jazz that holds sway with Bliss. Along with *guitar*ist Claude Perreault, this duo's repertoire also includes jazz and Latin standards and popular French songs of the '20s and '30s. Plus special guest Andy Milne bass.

Bruce Clausen & Danny Parker Dockside Lounge at the Granville Island Hotel FRI 7PM | Free

Mandolin/guitar virtuoso Bruce Clausen is interested in many musical traditions. He began his career in San Francisco's 1960s rock scene. Since then he has performed with the Vancouver Symphony and with jazz greats like Eddie "Lockjaw" Davis. Here he is joined by bassist Danny Parker (Rumba Calzada, Michael Bublé) in a program of jazzy café music from Brazil and Paris.

Juno nominated guitarist/composer Bill Coon is one of Canada's most highly sought after musicians. He's been performing for over two decades with numerous artists like Jimmy Heath, Eddie Daniels, Dr. Lonnie Smith, and P.J. Perry. Darren Radtke is one of the most lyrical bassists in the land. He is an outstanding soloist as well as a superlative accompanist.



Kate Hammett-Vaughan Quintet Performance Works Sun 12PM | Free

One of Canada's most distinctive jazz artists, Vancouverbased Kate Hammett-Vaughan's hip vocals have earned her three Juno nominations. Hailed as "a marvelous storyteller" (Toronto Star), and "the finest jazz vocal artist of her generation" (Halifax Chronicle Herald), she is supported and challenged at every turn by her remarkable and adventurous band. Vancouver- based Gabriel Mark Hasselbach is a Juno award-winning multi-instrumentalist with a firm grasp on contemporary and mainstream jazz idioms. He is a unique stylist on trumpet, flute, and fluegelhorn with over a dozen CDs under his own name. With Tilden Webb keyboards, Adam Rohrlick guitar, Jodi Proznick bass, Stephen Dick drums.



Kevin House/Inhabitants Performance Works SAT 8:30PM | \$18 adults, \$15 Seniors and Students



Vancouver singer/songwriter Kevin House boasts an impressive voice and keen melodic sense. His folksy CDs (Gutter Pastoral, World of Beauty) have drawn critical praise worldwide and comparisons to Nick Drake and Leonard Cohen. Roots Highway (Italy) refers to Kevin's "beautiful, disarming sadness". Americana-UK.com writes, "The spirit of early Tom Waits infuses this music with his metropolitan late night boho regret," while the Montreal Gazette alludes to "a priestly melancholy...all soft rain, windswept streets and one man wondering". With Mike Derrick guitar/piano/glockenspiel, Russell Sholberg bass/saw, Skye Brooks drums.

Vancouver's Inhabitants serve up sounds ranging from electric jazz-fusion inspired by Miles Davis to the instrumental post-rock of Tortoise to contemporary ambient grooves. Rich sonic textures, subtle melodic ideas, and a strong rhythmic sensibility are the signatures of this adventurous band. The foursome's second release on Drip Audio called *The Furniture Moves Underneath* moved The Globe and Mail to call it "one of the coolest discs of the year". Inhabitants are J.P. Carter trumpet/electronics, Dave Sikula guitar, Pete Schmitt electric bass, and Skye Brooks drums.





In a world of indie groups that all sound alike, Vancouver's Mother Mother is a true breath of fresh air with a sound all their own. Recently signed to indie powerhouse Last Gang Records, they are poised to become the next big thing. Performing the unique and often brilliant songs of Ryan Guldemond acoustic & electric guitar/vocals, their artfully directed sound is a mix of vaudevillian country, post-punk interludes, and harmonies that lie somewhere between Ian and Sylvia and the Pixies. Formed in January 2005, Mother Mother's wry lyricism touches on contemporary life in all its beauty and balderdash, and

their CD Touch Up sounds great. With Molly Guldemond vocals, Debra-Jean Creelman vocals, Jeremy Page bass, Ali Sidar drums.

Opening the show is Said the Whale. The brainchild of Ben Worcester guitar/vocals and Tyler Bancroft guitar/vocals, this up-and-coming quintet with its breezy, melodic sound is at the forefront of Vancouver's burgeoning indie scene. Laura Smith keyboards/vocals, Jeff Laforge bass/vocals and Spencer Schoening drums round out the band.




