The Paul Plimley Octet brings together eight musicians of highly varied performing background who share a common desire to develop a music which affords a complete spectrum of ensemble tone colours and melodic invention, a music that is both rhythmically alive and sustained in an atmosphere of sensitive lyricism and good humor.

## Comprising the Octet are:

Paul Plimley: (Vibes; Piano)

Cofounder of the New Orchestra Workshop (NOW) and recipient of a 1978 Canada Council grant.

Musical collaborator with Roscoe Mitchell, Gunther Christmann and Karl Berger; student of Cecil Taylor (1979).

The subject of half hour documentary about his music, Plimley has often been seen on television and heard on radio (Two New Hours, Jazz Canada, etc.) and has recorded three albums.

has appeared on numerous radio and T.V. shows.

For the most part, the Octet plays original compostions enhanced by each individual's interpretive collaboration. (Adapted material includes Thelonious Monk tunes and Sousa marches). Unique in concept, the Octet functions as a contemporary "mini-orchestra". Inspired by a number of regional traditions (especially Afro-American and European Classical), the band intends to communicate with as wide a range of listeners as possible.

The demo tape included here serves as an appetizer from the Octet's musical menu. The three excerpts are:

- 1) Miles (a piece inspired by Miles Davis, shows the Octet in "Jazz ambience").
- 2) From a Diary of Dreams (a ballade excerpted from a larger suite, writtenas was the first piece-by Paul Plimley.
- 3) The Chase (by Coat Cooke; a 5/4 funk melody with an extra punch).

An album is currently in the planning stages.
